DB's Dabblings: "Planning for the Summer"

As we work on "returning back to better than normal," we need to plan for the summer. Much of what we have been doing so far in 2021 in our restarting efforts has been focused on this semester and not looking ahead. For example, we restarted our Sunday morning Bible Classes developing our curriculum running through May. Now we are in the middle of April and we have not made clear plans for the summer. So in the last couple of weeks the Elders and Deacons and various ministry leaders have been working on summer plans and beyond. Although it is far from complete, let me share with you some plans to help you get excited about where we are going.

Part of our restart in Bible Classes and small groups involved taking steps to move carefully and safely back into meeting together in one Sunday morning assembly together, returning to Sunday morning classes, and making use of our Sunday nights to develop some of the other areas we wanted to restart when it was best to do so. The Sunday night program included returning to small groups, Family Bible Class, and Sunday night worship. After experimenting with different approaches we feel we are ready to apply what we have learn to some better approaches for the summer and to begin to develop other areas that we would like to restart. For example, we would love to do more with our fellowship gatherings, so the Deacons have been working on plans for various Wednesday night activities for the church to grow in fellowship and service. Instead of Sunday night worship on the 2nd and 4th Sunday nights we are going to have congregational fellowship luncheons with worship on the 2nd and 4th Sundays during the summer months. This will begin with a special luncheon on May 23rd when Jacob Bautista will be with us as our guest preacher. Instead of the Family Bible Class on the 2nd and 4th Sunday nights in the Fellowship Hall, we are going to be working on restoring a Sunday morning Children's Worship for our young children during the worship assembly to begin this summer. We feel our Sunday morning Bible Classes have got off to a good start and we will be developing our curriculum for the summer months and elevating our activities for both the children's and teens' ministries, including summer camps, mission and service trips, retreats, VBS, etc. We will continue to develop our small groups and encourage everyone to be involved in small group fellowship. I will continue our GPS class for all parents who wish to join us as we work on the topic, "Building Family Ministry," during the summer to strength our families and our church family.

We have learned some things about serving our community through COVID that we will use this summer to be "better than normal" by this fall. We are planning a community wide "memorial service" at our building the Sunday before Memorial Day, May 30 at 2:00 for anyone in our community who lost a loved one during 2020 and 2021. We will continue to do great work through the Basic Needs ministry serving those less fortunate in our area in cooperation with other help agencies. We will continue our great mission efforts in the prisons in our region of the US and in Zimbabwe teaching God's Word using "New Life Behavior" and "World Bible School" materials, and find ways to improve our efficiency and effectiveness in distribution, use of resources and follow-up. And we are taking steps this summer to improve our outreach to Tarleton State University next fall. (continued on page 2)
