

The Risen Way

WELCOME to *your* faith community! We are happy to worship with you today and pray that your spirit will be blessed by our time together in the presence of God. If this is your first time at Zion, welcome! If you have been with us for some time, welcome! Welcome back to in-person worship! Please remember to properly wear your face mask at all times inside and to socially distance.

Last week's scriptures focused on seeing with Thomas stating he wanted to see the nail-scarred hands of the Savior to know he had risen as we shared testimonies of the resurrection power today. This week's scriptures focus on touching with Jesus trying to ground the disciples' faith in the reality of his presence, in the concreteness of his being. He told them to touch him; he ate in front of them. He was announcing that he was real. What can we provide, what hands-on proof can we give that Jesus is alive among us? Of course, we have been in a pandemic and touching is still not something we want to engage in. But we still know and feel examples of lives being touched, and hearts being touched.

What examples do we see, envision, and feel led to act upon to prove Jesus' presence? What work do we do to show our commitment to the "Risen Way," otherwise known as the "work of Easter." Essentially the way or foundation of our faith. How do we live our faith today? How do we interact with our community, meeting their needs in a socially distanced world? How do we prove our Lord is risen indeed? Our words and stories are a great start, but how do we act or show our faith? Maybe our Soup Kitchen Ministry or another outreach program we currently have, or a new addition?

All: We come together to touch grace in the presence of the Spirit of Christ.

1 John 3:1-7 (NRSV) Lector: Aaron Kelly

"Jesus Shall Reign"

¹ See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. ² Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. ³ And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure. ⁴ Everyone who commits sin is guilty of lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. ⁵ You know that he was revealed to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. ⁶ No one who abides in him sins; no one who sins has either seen him or known him. ⁷ Little children, let no one deceive you. Everyone who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous.

Gospel Lesson[↑]

Luke 24:36b-48 (NRSV) Pastor Katie

³⁶ While they were talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." ³⁷ They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. ³⁸ He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? ³⁹ Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." ⁴⁰ And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. ⁴¹ While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" ⁴² They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³ and he took it and ate in their presence. ⁴⁴ Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." ⁴⁵ Then he

opened their minds to understand the scriptures, ⁴⁶ and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷ and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. ⁴⁸ You are witnesses of these things.





Take Action this Earth Day

PERSONAL:

- 1. Get your soil & water tested for lead.
- 2. Learn about public transit and advocate for better access- air pollution leads to respiratory conditions such as asthma. Advocate for better public transit in your municipality. Also do your part to try to bike, walk, or carpool.
- 3. Visit The Native Land App to learn about the indigenous people from the land you occupy.

COMMUNITY:

- 1. Get involved in gardening and/or food access justice. The Covid-19 pandemic has highlighted the disparities in food distribution systems. Growing your own food can lower your grocery bill and it cuts down emissions from food transportation. You can also volunteer at a community garden that supplies fresh produce to food pantries.
- 2. Learn how your church can become a hub of climate resilience at creationjustice.org/ resilience

3. Find where waste from your community goes? Waste is disproportionately disposed of in communities of color. Sometimes waste and recycling are even shipped to be disposed of in other countries. Find ways to reduce your own waste through reducing consumption, composting, and refusing to acquire products that will end up in landfills.

- 2. Mark your calendar for Ecumenical Advocacy Days 2021 & participate in the day of action. This year is free of charge and online. The theme is "Imagine! God's Earth & People Restored". Creation Justice Ministries will be hosting six excellent workshops.
- 3. Do you know which watershed you live in? Learn about the bodies of water near you, the watershed you live in, and the pollutants your water faces. Water is a human right and gift from God, advocate for everyone to have equitable access to potable water.
