Text: Titus 1:1-4

Title: The Faith of God's Elect and the Acknowledgment of the Truth

Introduction

I. An Apostle of Jesus Christ

- II. The Importance of the Apostle to the faith of the elect of God and the acknowledgment of the truth.
- III. Now that inspired written Apostolic Word is proclaimed to you.
  - A. There are those who are looking for the worldly trappings of 'spirituality.'
  - B. There are those who refuse any teaching and the demands of Christ if such impinges on what they want to do!
  - C. Let us examine ourselves: Christians are humble to obey what we are taught and submit to it without dissent.
- IV. The Faith of God's Elect *that is* The Knowledge of the Truth which Accords with Godliness.
  - A. The Saving Faith of God's Elect has definite knowledge content.
  - B. We should be warned against of every idea that equates biblical faith with personal opinion and feeling.
  - C. Faith is not grounded in changing probabilities, but holds what is true from God who is truth and cannot lie.
