Fourth 'Good Shepherd' Sunday of Easter – 25th April 2021

I am the good shepherd and I lay down my life for my sheep

Fr Barry Weymes was my neighbour in Cobham. Retired and frail, a priest of many years, he would invariably greet me affectionately as 'my pastor'. We tend to use the term 'parish priest', but pastor is in fact the more accurate term for that office.

All Christians are called to lay down their lives in service of one form or another: in the family, in work or in some particular apostolate. The Gospel today has always had particular significance for those who God calls to Holy Orders, and it is appropriate that Good Shepherd Sunday should have a particular focus on prayer for vocations to the priesthood and diaconate. They are called, in a particular way, to model themselves on Christ the Good Shepherd. Jesus's words about the hired man encourages them to persevere in the duties entrusted to them. His own concern for 'those who are not of this flock' encourages them to look outward.

Celibacy in the life of a priest is an outward sign of the gift of self. Freely promised, it runs against contemporary expectations, yet once given it makes one free to leave and move on when the Lord calls. It is the expression of love for the Church, the body of Christ, and for the beautiful and 'smelly' people who make up the Lord's flock. And many of those who think celibacy unreasonable often forget that married life has its sorrows as well as its joys and that many find themselves single - by virtue of death, separation, dedication to some cause or just not having found an appropriate spouse.

As I pray through the scriptures this week, I recognise God's hand in drawing me into the mystery of the Good Shepherd. I give thanks for my vocation as priest and the many blessings I have received through it. I would encourage anyone thinking about a vocation to pray it through and explore it, and for parents not to be afraid of where the journey might lead. Do pray for vocations to the priesthood and diaconate from our parish and for our diocese, and for the holiness of those of us who already serve, that we may always have outward signs of the Good Shepherd in our midst.
