Living the Resurrection

The resurrected Jesus interacted with his disciples in ways that engaged all the senses.

He told them to look at his hands and feet, to touch and see that he was real flesh and bones (Luke24:39-40). He even ate with the disciples proving he was not a ghost, but a real live person. Jesus modeled the essentials of resurrection - *coming alive*. Not only was Jesus physically alive, but purposefully alive. His resurrection still vividly declares there are greater things to come. Despite what has happened, faith turns us toward the promise that perpetually springs from the resurrection of Christ—the promise of more abundant and everlasting life.

To that end, the Holy Spirit indwells us and stirs our spirits to *come alive* for greater purposes so God's kingdom may come, so God's kin'dom may *come alive*. We each are charged to live lives worthy of God's grace and mercy. While some endeavors may come with ease, other efforts will purposefully stretch us to grow into the fullness God intends. This is living the resurrection.

Living the resurrection must be a comprehensive way of life. It cannot be put on for worship, then taken off like a suit of clothes and stored for the rest of the time. It is not like a pair of shoes to be chosen for comfort or convenience. Living the resurrection emerges from within. To *come alive* requires coming to the end of the self and allowing the power of Holy Spirit to strive and thrive through you.

Living the resurrection is living a different kind of life to bring forth a different kind of world. Too often the Church of casual or occasional Christianity coddles the ways of the common world with its complacency, callousness, corruption, etc., as it seeks comfort and conformity over the challenge of and commitment to change. The Church of casual or occasional Christianity goes along to get along; kicks the can of inequitable conditions down the road rather than taking a gracious but courageous stand to open the can of truth and apply the balm of justice. It is time for the Church of courageous, committed Christianity to *come alive*.

This last year has been difficult for me as a deep processor. It is painful to continual-

ly process the capacity human beings have for inhumane behavior and harmful indifference. At times, my soul groans too deep for words as my brown body physically aches with empathetic stress from the epidemic scourge of suffering. My experiential faith confirms that I am fully alive and charged to purposely move forward. Jesus' followers are not to be passive souls, but committed spirits moving in the light, strength, and faith of Christ. Jesus did not say life would be easy for His followers. In fact, He warned of the persecution and suffering in his name (Matthew 24:9). But Jesus promised never to leave or forsake us, and I am grateful for the anchoring and guiding presence of the Holy Spirit that is available to all. So, I pray for all as Paul did for the Ephesians:

"For this reason, I bow my knees before [God], from whom every family in heaven and on earth takes its name. I pray that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant that you may be strengthened in

your inner being with power through his Spirit, and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love. I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God." (Eph 3:14-19)

I pray that as you are filled with the fullness of God, that you will move with the Spirit, committed to a life of courageous Christianity that challenges rather than conforms to the world. I pray that, with the counsel of the Spirit, you will do as Howard Thurman advised, "Don't ask what the world needs. Ask what makes you come alive and go do it. Because what the world needs is people who have come alive." What the world needs is people living the resurrection! May it be so and to God be the glory!



Racial Justice Movement



Who Do You Look Like?

I confess that I love southern gospel music. I usually listen to it on my way to church on Sunday morning. Last week, a song came on that immediately took me to our service with the Rescue Mission of Salt Lake. Some of the lyrics go like this:

I saw them giving food to the hungry,

Beneath the bridge in Nashville, Tennessee.

Someone looked my way and asked, who are they?

I said, "Looks like Jesus to me".

Looks like Jesus to me, looks like what he's called us to be.

I think that's what he'd do, if he were me and you.

When we love the broken people that we see, Looks like Jesus to me.

When I went home and looked at the YouTube video of this song, it could have been taken in the parking lot of the Rescue Mission where our Share the Bounty donations are unloaded each month. It could have been taken at the Friday night chapel service where our praise band plays one Friday night a month. It could have been serving hot meals to the homeless or handing out hats and gloves at Christmas. In January 2021, the Rescue Mission served over 11,000 meals and provided over 3700 nights of shelter. Did you know that they now have five locations, including transitional housing units for men and women who graduate from their New Life Program? When the earthquake heavily damaged the downtown building in March 2020, the Rescue Mission



found a way to keep going by relocating to an empty building in South Jordan. Hilltop volunteers continued to make deliveries there until repairs were made and clients and staff could return "home".

When I listen to "Looks Like Jesus to Me", I see the faces of Hilltop members who have served over many years. I am grateful for each one of them who have been the hands and feet of Jesus to the hungry and homeless. As the Rescue Mission says, "our support restores broken lives and lifts people off the streets".

Our next opportunity to serve is on Saturday, May 1st from 10 am to 2pm. It is a drive thru drop off food drive in front of Hilltop House. Canned and non-perishable food items are most appreciated. The donations are divided and delivered by our volunteers to the Rescue Mission and Crossroads Urban Center. Sign-up to sing with the Praise Band or to serve hot meals from the Rescue Mission kitchen. You can make monthly donations by joining the Monthly Miracle Makers at the Rescue Mission who provide ongoing support. It is a privilege and blessing to serve our neighbors.

Thanks to our worship, music & arts, and trustee teams; we (Staff- Parish) have an opportunity to come alive!

Did you know that our worship team made a recommendation at the February 21st Church Council meeting?

It read-"At Hilltop UMC, one of our primary goals is to provide meaningful worship to as many people as possible. Through worship we love, honor, and learn about or God. We share insights into His being and His objectives for our world. Through worship we lead souls to the Lord". They also said "We are committed to live-streaming services whether we can meet in person or not! At this point we have exhausted the knowledge of our own parishioners and need to hire a specialist who can bring us to a new level of competence".

We launched a Live Stream Ministry in March 2020, as the Covid Pandemic shut down all in -worship times at our sanctuary. The AV team, Music and Arts team, and the Worship team learned and grew from our start-up to where are now with our capability and quality of producing a "Live" worship service for all those who cannot attend, choose not to attend, or are out of our Salt Lake Valley. The AV team members are all volunteers, some have full time jobs, part time jobs, and others are retirees or semi retired. They like you, live busy lives and have stretched their knowledge and expertise to "get it right", yet they are volunteers, just like many of you that serve the Lord and the Hilltop community.

Did you know that we have a range of 250 to 936 live stream views per service since we have been providing this ministry?

Did you know that our current, 2021 YTD live-stream activity continues to average over 350 views every Sunday with our two highest Sundays being 409 on January 31st and 400 on April 18th?

Since reopening under safe Covid protocols and conference and district approval on March 21st; we have averaged 58 per Sunday service and our highest was Easter attendance in the sanctuary at 105. Our trustees have our seating defined with 6' physical distancing and all attendees are wearing masks. Your safety is our number one priority. Children's Books for Discussion of Race and Inequality at Home



This Month's Book: The Library Bus Story by Bahram Rahman, Pictures by Gabrielle Grimard. Available in the Salt Lake County and Salt Lake City Library systems

I was delighted to find a book about libraries on the new book shelf at our branch recently. Pari's mother's library is a bit unusual, though--it is a library bus! This gentle story about a mobile library serving refugee girls in Kabul, Afghanistan brought back memories of the bookmobile that visited my own elementary school and also offered a slice of life in war-torn Afghanistan. Pari's mother drives the bus to small villages and refugee camps and offers English lessons and reading materials to young girls. She recalls that not so long ago, girls were not allowed to be educated at all and remembers learning to read in secret with her father as her teacher. Pari is inspired by the eagerness to learn she sees in the girls who visit the library bus and looks forward to the day when she will be able to attend school on her own. The author is a physician from Afghanistan who immigrated to Canada in 2012 as a refugee. He wrote The Library Bus to highlight the challenges that children in countries at war experience in seeking education.

What Do The Kids Think?

Heidi- I liked that Pari and her mother helped other girls to learn on the library bus.



Clark- I liked that Pari's mother helped girls to read just like her father helped her.

Questions for Reflection and Discussion

- How would you learn if you didn't have a school to attend? What would you do if it was illegal for you to learn, like it was for Pari's mother?
- What role does a library (on a bus or in a building) play in building community in a village, refugee camp, or city? Why is it important for learning opportunities to be available for everyone?

Hilltop UMC Church-wide Work Day

The theme for May is "Living the Resurrection." One might wonder how this fits into the role of the Trustees at Hilltop, but to me it seems like a good fit with the upcoming Church-wide Work Day on Saturday May 8 from 9am – 1pm.

Spring itself is a time of resurrection as plants, grass, etc. long-dormant over the cold winter months are "re-born" to the lengthening days and warming temperatures. Despite the fact that we're not back to "full activity" level at Hilltop we are getting there, and with the increase in activities we'll be wanting and needing to utilize the whole Hilltop campus, inside and out. Mother Nature hasn't been significantly impacted by the pandemic, so leaves and needles have still fallen into places we don't want them, plants and weeds have still grown where we don't really want them, paint has still peeled and flaked away, and we even have some projects for those more indoor-inclined (we really do need to get a good inventory of our "stuff"). And let's face it, we all want a little outdoor exercise and fellowship.

Here's a list of projects we'd like to get accomplished:

- Scrape and Paint door frames on garage (lawn equipment shed, main overhead door, and north entrance door)
- Clean out pine straw from lower West exit walkway/shrubs

- Clean out pine straw/debris from lower area on East side (AC unit area)
- Relocate mailbox to outside Kitchen back door (includes new mailbox installation) – materials provided
- Clean out planter boxes on East side of main parking lot/driveway
- Clean out fenced area on West side of Hilltop House.
- Clean-up of unimproved "lot" between the Best House and the west parking lot
- Trim the ivy on the fence on East side of the AC area.
- Clean-up of hedge on north side of parking lot.
- Clean-up garage and lawn equipment shed
- Clean-up of east boundary of parking lot
- On-site inventories of church property (i.e. chairs, tables, vacuums, etc., may include some climbing of ladders)

While we do have some tools (rakes, shovels, etc.) you're encouraged to bring your own if you're more comfortable with them. Masks are optional for outside projects, but we request that you wear them when you're inside the church building. If you're not available on May 8th, feel free to contact one of the trustees, or the church office, to make arrangements to "claim" one of the projects and do it at your convenience.
