May is one my favorite months of the year. As I was looking at my calendar for May 2021, I noticed there are at least three special days that we love to celebrate during this month. Of course, there is Mother's Day, as we honor our moms in many different ways. Then there is Memorial Day when we honor those who paid the ultimate sacrifice by giving their lives to serve our country. The third day we remember is Pentecost, which is the birthday of the church. It's a time when after remembering the death and resurrection of Jesus, now brings a celebration of the Holy Spirit that Jesus promised to us. This year it falls on Sunday, May 23, 2021.

When you think about it, this special day can go by unnoticed in our society today. However, the implications are without limits. The Holy Spirit can live within us to empower, comfort and guide us to live out the Christian life in a spirit-led adventure. Now that's worth celebrating!

Several years ago, I read a book entitled "The Hole in Our Holiness" by Kevin DeYoung. I have shared some quotes from him before. The hole in our holiness is that some people look at holiness as the jimmies on an ice cream cone or extra toppings on our pizza. It can be the optional things we choose from like when we are buying a new car with many bells and whistles. Others look at holiness as some "unattainable other" that can never be experienced by real people. Throughout time, the call to "be Holy for I am Holy," says the Lord" is pretty clear! So how do we connect with a Holy God in a broken and fragmented world today?

Isaiah, a mighty follower of God, in the beginning of his ministry, connected with God. In fact, he said, "I saw the Lord." At that moment, he saw the amazing power of God, and then himself, in a new way. God cared for his soul, and then Isaiah responded to God to use his life. This took place during one of those difficult times for both Isaiah and the people of his time. However, the Lord took care of Isaiah and the people. Isaiah chose to live a holy life 2900 years ago in response to seeing the Lord.

My prayer is that we would also live a holy life as we journey together! There are many places we find in God's Word where the Lord is calling us to a deeper loving relationship with Him and others. Would you join me to continue to pray for the days ahead? There is much to trust the Lord for as we look to the future, as we pray for Pastor Scott Rambo and family and all that the Lord has in store for all of us. Even though we may not always be sure where life is taking us, we do know from Isaiah's life, that God showed up at the right time. Anything can happen to transform lives and everyone around us for His will and His Glory!

Bottles will be distributed on Mother's Day and Collected on Father's Day.



We stay connected daily with friends and pastors in Haiti who do cry out to the Lord in their many serious trials. Political chaos and crime go virtually unchecked, especially in the capital city of Port-au-Prince. The leaders of the UEBH (Union of Evangelical Baptists of Haiti) have invited me to come down in mid-May to participate in the STEP (Seminaire Theologique Evangelique de Port-au-Prince) graduation ceremony of student pastors and to visit the believers. Please pray with me to know the Lord's will in this. The US Embassy advises that Haiti is too dangerous for visitors, yet flights still operate, and some Americans do go in and out of the country. I realize one cannot serve the Lord without risks, and I'm leaning toward going, but I do ask for your prayers.

Another matter is the great need for a new vehicle for our UEBH ministry, the House of Hope in Haiti. Since 1956 the HOH provides physical and medical live-in hope to nearly 100 Haitian children with many types of illnesses, mainly TB and severe malnutrition. The main goal, of course, is to not only bring healing to their bodies, but most of all to see these kids place their faith in Christ. Check out the House of Hope at https:// wwwhouseofhopehaiti1-lapointe.org. The price of a new Nissan, not a fancy one, just a plain pickup truck,


truck is \$37,000. That's because of shipping and custom taxes. Used trucks in Haiti are just too beat up to be feasible. The Lord has provided \$23,000 so far through donations. Joyce and I and our son David have decided to take a big step of faith and make up the difference. When that truck comes in, Linda and Jenny, who oversee the HOH ministry, will be filled with joy and gratitude for what God has done. I will let you know how it all turns out.

We praise the Lord for you, our faithful supporters, in this the 50<sup>th</sup> year SIHCG we were accepted by Crossworld as missionaries. We are blessed beyond measure to serve Christ and equally blessed by your gifts that have made it all possible. To God be the glory!

For the Sheetz's, March began quite stormy. We're hoping for a calmer end to it. Have you heard? Tim and Kathy got COVID!!! Yes! We did! It was a bit of a rough patch for us both, but, at least, we got to "weather it" together. (Weather it! Get it?? If you don't, you don't know Tim!) Our symptoms reared their ugly heads on March 3<sup>rd</sup>; but we had already started quarantining from the 1st, having been aware of a possible exposure. Symptoms began subsiding about ten days later.



We've been wonderfully spoiled by family and friends over these days. Get well cards, phone calls, emails and texts daily to check on us. Daughters who routinely call to ask our "vitals," and giving lots of advice if our oxygen levels were one tick down or our temperature checks one tick up! Food being left on our porch by dear ones who dropped it and "ran," at least to the curb in front of the house, before letting us know it was there. We've had some lovely conversations through our closed front door, happy to keep our loved ones safe. We have felt pretty unwell physically — but - sooooo loved!

Thank you for praying for us. Most of you didn't know to pray about our encounter with COVID but our great God assigned your prayers specifically to our need. HE is quite awesome! YOU are so dear to us. We are grateful for each one of you.


# COLE RING PAGE


Jesus commands us to be his witnesses. This craft is a reminder to reach out to all our "circles."

#### What you need:

- 5 bowls or cups (assorted sizes)
- Construction paper
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Brad fastener
- Crayons or markers

#### What you do:

- Place the bowls and cups upside down, each on a different color of paper.
   Trace around the circles and cut them out.
- 2. With a pencil, pierce a small hole atop each circle. Layer circles on each other from largest to smallest, aligning the holes. Insert the brad through all layers.
- 3. Starting in the center, label the circles *my house, my city, my state, my country, the world.* Draw a picture on each one.
- 4. Pray, asking Jesus how you can spread his message.
