Today in church we will be exploring the story of the Vine and the Branches:

John 15:1-8

¹ "I am the true vine; my Father is the gardener. ² He cuts off every branch of mine that does not produce fruit. And he trims and cleans every branch that produces fruit so that it will produce even more fruit. ³ You are already clean because of the words I have spoken to you. ⁴ Remain in me, and I will remain in you. No branch can produce fruit alone. It must remain in the vine. It is the same with you. You cannot produce fruit alone. You must remain in me. ⁵ "I am the vine, and you are the branches. If a person remains in me and I remain in him, then he produces much fruit. But without me he can do nothing. ⁶ If anyone does not remain in me, then he is like a branch that is thrown away. That branch dies. People pick up dead branches, throw them into the fire, and burn them. ⁷ Remain in me and follow my teachings. If you do this, then you can ask for anything you want, and it will be given to you. ⁸ You should produce much fruit and show that you are my followers. This brings glory to my Father.

Discussion:

Questions to discuss as a family:

What do you think it means to "remain in God"?

What do you think "God fruit" looks like?

The branch of an apple tree connected to the trunk will produce apples! When we are connected to God and filled with God's love that is the fruit we produce. We can bring a flavor of God and heaven to those we meet on the earth. The Holy Spirit in us helps us to produce good fruit.

Jesus told His disciples that He is like a vine, and we are like branches of the vine.





Family Activities

Here are some activities you can do together as a family and discussion ideas to explore God's word together.

Family Activity 1:

The passage today is all about staying connected to God. Can you stay connected to each other with these activities? Set up an obstacle course using furniture from around your home and see if you can complete it as a family all staying connected! Use a scarf or piece of fabric to join family members together at the ankle and complete a three-legged race.

Family Activity 2:

Make a tree craft together by collecting some twigs or branches. You could use an empty jar, bottle, or flower pot to support your tree. Here are some ideas of items you could make and attach to the tree.

- Decorations with the names of friends, peers, or acquaintances to use as a reminder to pray for others.
- Decorations with the fruits of the Spirit on them as a reminder of how we can choose to live for God every day.

Galatians 5: 22-23 teaches us about the fruit of the Spirit, the godly character and behavior that the Holy Spirit helps to grow in us. When we are connected with God and the Holy Spirit our behavior and character become more like God's. Spend some time waiting on God together, pray and ask the Holy Spirit to help you to produce godly fruit in your own lives. Which of these

Help us to be producers of good fruit in the world, sharing your love with others,


so that they can know of your love too.


Some Ideas to keep connected with God this week:
