### **Annual Business Meeting Information**

### Annual Meeting—Sunday, January 31 at 11:00AM

Each January our church meets to celebrate another year of the Lord's faithfulness and to look toward a new year of increased fruit. We will ask the congregation to approve a new proposed budget, ratify a slate of leaders, and approve several bylaws amendments. The prayerful participation of all who make Hoodview Church their church home is requested as we gather for this annual meeting.



Who may vote at a church business meeting? The bylaws (Article III) give voting rights to persons meeting these three qualifications:

- Be a Christian (The church shall consist of believers in Christ who take the New Testament as their rule of faith and practice. An individual is understood to be a Christian upon confession of faith in Jesus Christ as Lord of one's life.)
- Be at least eighteen (18) years or older.
- Have attended Hoodview Church of God regularly for a period of at least six (6) months. A waiver of the sixmonth period is permissible for those requesting such a waiver by a majority vote at the meeting.

As we prepare for this annual meeting, the following resources or options are provided:

- Annual Report booklets will be available by Sunday, January 17.
- A **Town Hall Q&A Meeting** will be held on Sunday, January 24 at 11:00 a.m. in the sanctuary. Feel free to ask questions about the reports, budget or any business matter.
- Council members or pastors are available to answer questions as well. Current Council members include David Beatty, Mary Danielson, Edson Gilmore, Gary Johnson, Dave Laurance, Ruth Palmer and Dee Shrock.

**Council Nominees:** Mary Danielson, Frieda Lanting, and Craig Roenicke are nominees for the Leadership Council vacancies. See the Annual Report booklet for testimonies of these nominees.

**Bylaws Amendments:** The Council will present several proposed changes to the current bylaws, which deal with the size and makeup of the Council, how often it is to meet, and some of their responsibilities. Two other changes concern updating the quorum needed for business meetings (changing to a percentage of average attendance instead of a fixed number). See the Annual Report Booklet for detailed explanation.
