Historical Context

- Jerusalem is in ruins
- The temple of Solomon is torn down
- Judah is destroyed
- The sacred vessels are now in the hand of a heathen king
- God's people are now called "not my people"

Redemptive Context

Out of the tragedy, unspeakable loss and sorrow of the conquest of Jerusalem, God began to reveal His great ultimate, consummating purposes that embrace the nations and people of the whole earth.

Historical Context

- Daniel is the author and his name means "God is my judge."
- Contemporary prophets are Ezekiel, Habakkuk, Jeremiah & Zephaniah.

- **Ezekiel 14** refers to Daniel as being "righteous and wise".
- **Hebrews 11:32-33** refers to Daniel as one of, "the prophets who through faith stopped the mouths of lions."

Theme

The Sovereignty and Power of God Over Heaven's Affairs

"The Most High rules the kingdom of men and gives it to whom he wills." Daniel 4:25

The God who directs the forces of history has not deserted His people. They must trust in Him, because his promises of preservation and ultimate restoration are as sure as the coming Messiah.

Historical Context

- Book of Daniel spans the length of the entire Babylonian exile
- Daniel taken captive to Babylon in 605 BC
- Daniel lives through entire exile
- Babylonians later conquered by the Medes & Persians
- Chronology of the historical narrative: ch. 1-4, 7, 8, 5, 9, 6

Historical Context

- Chapters 1-4, 7-8 occur during the reign of the Babylonians.

 Chapter 5 records the fall of the last Babylonian king & the takeover by the Medes.

- Chapters 9 & 6 record events that occurred during the reign of the new empire, called the Medo-Persian Empire.

Redemptive-Historical Context

- The people of God captured by the Gentiles
- The people of God persecuted and afflicted by the Gentiles
- Who sovereignly rules the earth?

Key Theme

The Most High, the God of Daniel, sovereignly rules and reigns supreme over all mankind. Therefore His people are brave in the face of persecution.

Message

God is God over all peoples of the earth, not just the Jews.

Daniel's Interpretation of Nebuchadnezzar's Dream

It is a decree of the Most High, which has come upon my lord the king, that you shall be driven from among men, and your dwelling shall be with the beasts of the field. You shall be made to eat grass like an ox, and you shall be wet with the dew of heaven, and seven periods of time shall pass over you, till you know that the Most High rules the kingdom of men and gives it to whom he will. And as it was commanded to leave the stump of the roots of the tree, your kingdom shall be confirmed for you from the time that you know that Heaven rules.

Daniel 2, 7 & 8 Nebuchadnezzar's dream of a statue crushed by a rock

"You saw, O king, and behold, a great image. This image, mighty and of exceeding brightness, stood before you, and its appearance was frightening. The head of this image was of fine gold, its chest and arms of silver, its middle and thighs of bronze, its legs of iron, its feet partly of iron and partly of clay.

Daniel 2:31-33

Nebuchadnezzar's dream of a statue crushed by a rock

As you looked, a stone was cut out by no human hand, and it struck the image on its feet of iron and clay, and broke them in pieces.

Nebuchadnezzar's dream of a statue crushed by a rock

Each section of the statue represents four successive kingdoms

- Nebuchadnezzar's kingdom- the golden head

- Babylonians will be succeeded by 3 other kingdoms

 The last kingdom will be as strong as iron but fragile as clay because it will be divided

Nebuchadnezzar's dream of a statue crushed by a rock

And in the days of those kings the God of heaven will set up a kingdom that shall never be destroyed, nor shall the kingdom be left to another people. It shall break in pieces all these kingdoms and bring them to an end, and it shall stand forever.

 The "silver chest and arms" - Babylonian Empire taken over by the Medo-Persian Empire in 539 BC

- The "legs of bronze" - Kingdom of Persia was conquered by Alexander the Great of Greece in around 332 BC

- The "feet of iron and clay" - The Roman Empire 2nd & 1st C. BC

- The "rock cut out without hands" - The Kingdom of Heaven

2:35 Then the iron, the clay, the bronze, the silver, and the gold, all together were broken in pieces, and became like the chaff of the summer threshing floors; and the wind carried them away, so that not a trace of them could be found. But the stone that struck the image became a great mountain and filled the whole earth.

2:44 And in the days of those kings the God of heaven will set up a kingdom that shall never be destroyed, nor shall the kingdom be left to another people. It shall break in pieces all these kingdoms and bring them to an end, and it **shall stand forever**.

Daniel 7 & 8 - Daniel's Dream

"As I looked, thrones were placed, and the Ancient of Days took his seat; his clothing was white as snow, and the hair of his head like pure wool; his throne was fiery flames; its wheels were burning fire. A stream of fire issued and came out from before him; a thousand thousands served him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him; the court sat in judgment, and the books were opened. "I looked then because of the sound of the great words that the horn was speaking. And as I looked, the beast was killed, and its body destroyed and given over to be burned with fire. As for the rest of the beasts, their dominion was taken away, but their lives were prolonged for a season and a time.

In the first year of his reign, I, Daniel, perceived in the books the number of years that, according to the word of the Lord to Jeremiah the prophet, must pass before the end of the desolations of Jerusalem, namely, seventy years.

Daniel 9:2

Seventy weeks are decreed about your people and your holy city, to finish the transgression, to put an end to sin, and to atone for iniquity, to bring in everlasting righteousness, to seal both vision and prophet, and to anoint a most holy place.

Know therefore and understand that from the going out of the word to restore and build Jerusalem to the coming of an anointed one, a prince, there shall be seven weeks.

Daniel 9:24-25

And after the sixty-two weeks, **an anointed one** shall be cut off and shall have nothing. And the people of **the prince who is to come** shall destroy the city and the sanctuary. Its end shall come with a flood, and to the end there shall be war. Desolations are decreed.

Predictive Prophecies about the **Future** of the People of God

How does Daniel speak to our life as exiles in this world?

Chapters 4 & 5 - People who set themselves up against the Most High will be humbled, to their **everlasting** benefit or regret.

Chapters 3 & 6 - Remain steadfast as servants of a sovereign Lord even when you suffer **persecution** and opposition for your faith.

How does Daniel speak to our life as exiles in this world?

Chapters 2, 7 & 8 - The earthly kingdoms/powers around us are passing away. Learn from Daniel's hope in God and thank God for the end of exile because of Christ.

Chapters 10-12 - Look to the eternal reward that is waiting for followers of the Most High when we arrive at our **final** home with God.

"Oh come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the Lord, our Maker! For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of **his hand**."
