Our Themes for 2018 were preparing ourselves to be instruments and representatives for God no matter where we are; to serve God better and to get to know ourselves and Jesus better; and learning to stand for God even against opposition.

Our goals for 2018 were:

1. To expand the VIP Bible Study from once a month to twice a month.
2. To revamp the VIP's participation in Church.
3. To participate together in one activity per year.
4. To meet at least 4 times a year or as needed to plan events and activities.

Goals accomplished in 2018:

1. The VIP Bible Study was expanded to twice a month—meeting the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of the month.
2. We studied Daniel chapters 1-7 and Acts chapters 1-5.
3. The youth have given their service in many areas of the church in 2018. As a group they are now responsible for the morning service on 4th Sunday. Some of the VIP's assist with children's church on Sunday and Wednesday. The VIP's also assist with Community Day.
4. Most of our VIP's have distinguished themselves academically.
5. The VIP's participated in and enjoyed our trip to Dave and Busters.
6. One of our VIP's started a new Mime ministry within the church.
7. Most of our VIP's participated in the educational opportunities offered by other ministries within Oasis of Hope Ministries and activities within the community.
8. The VIP team in 2018 met when needed to plan and discuss the progress of the ministry.



Greetings!

Turning Point CDC partners with Oasis of Hope Ministries to empower the communities of Warren, Vance, Granville, and Franklin counties. We believe that rural communities can thrive and flourish and we are excited about the role that we play as a 501c3 nonprofit organization in making our communities a thriving place for adults, children and youth, and families to live, work, play, and worship.

In July 2018, I relocated back to North Carolina and began in the role of Executive Director for Turning Point CDC. I am honored to serve my community in this capacity and to measure the impact that we, as a team and community, will accomplish.

As an organization we strive to be a bridge builder for our communities. We work with community and national partners to ensure that our communities have access to high-quality resources. We focus our work in four pillars and have made great progress in building relationships and programs to support our community and vision of a thriving rural community. We currently partner with the following entities in a variety of capacities: Oasis of Hope Ministries, Warren County Schools, Vance County Economic Development Commission, Athletes For Computer Science, Microsoft, The Conservation Fund- Resourceful Communities, Walmart Community Foundation, Franklin Granville Vance Smart Start and Safe Kids, Granville Vance Public Health, Vance County Fire Dept & Vance County EMS, Green Rural Redevelopment Organization/Mobile Farmers Market, Vance Granville Community College, Philanthropy, LLC and the Henderson Downtown Development Commission.

A few of our accomplishments thus far include partnering with Athletes For Computer Science to teach 120 elementary students coding to all four elementary schools in Warren County School district. We are very proud to be nonprofit partners with Microsoft, which provides volunteers as needed and hosts educational events at the store and in our rural community. We are excited about relaunching Champions of Hope in the Spring of 2019 as we have developed a partnership with Vance Granville Community College to include employability and soft-skills training. We are always excited to co-host the annual Community Day in August. The 2018 event had over 260 in attendance. During this event we distributed over 150 backpacks, over 300 free hotdog meals, and over 25 free haircuts. We have a variety of community vendors participate in the event including health screenings, educational activities, local entertainment, games, etc. We are also proud to be home to 9 scholarship and grant funds that support higher education and community development.

I hope that you enjoy this report and are encouraged by the work that we are achieving on behalf our communities. Thank you for your continuous support and encouragement!

SCHOLARSHIP & GRANT FUNDS

Bryan L. Davis Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund honors the late Bryan L. Davis and supports college students who are experiencing challenging circumstances.

Chalis S. Henderson Scholarship Fund

The mission of the Chalis Sledge Henderson Scholarship Foundation is to ensure that the educational needs of students in our community are met by serving as a resource for students who are actively involved in greater communities and striving for academic excellence. In 2018, an award of \$1000 was given to Ron Davis, entering freshman at UNC Chapel Hill. The fund is also currently supporting Alexis Jordan, a junior at UNC Chapel Hill. Both students are graduates of Warren County High School.

First Gen Fund

The First Gen Fund is unique because it is more than just financial support. This fund comes with a network of support from professionals who were also the first in their family to attend college. Scholars will be connected to professionals that understand the fears, the emotional, cultural and financial challenges, and the pressure that first generation college students face. By connecting generations of shared experience together we are creating a stronger, intentional support system for students.

Human Rights Social Justice Fund

The fund will finance a portion of the legal fees for People of Color who experience blatant acts of physical and/or emotional abuse, hatred and injustice in the city of Pittsburgh, PA.

I AM the Light Scholarship Fund

John 8:12 Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." As a former High School dropout, God used education as a light for Emiola Jay Oriola, founder of this scholarship fund. The mission of the "I AM the light of the world scholarship" is to provide marginalized youth with the opportunity to learn at the next level by removing barriers that stop them from seeing God's image of them. This scholarship is also an entity of My Father's Business, International, an organization with a mission to engage culture, create culture, and transform culture for the Glory of God.

Ozzie & Me Scholarship Fund

The mission is to inspire young mothers to overcome the stigmas and obstacles of young motherhood and reach their academic goals. In 2018, an award of \$1000 was presented to Ra'naa Billingsly, a student-mother at Duquesne University.

The Thirsty Mind Scholarship Fund

The mission of The Thirsty Mind Scholarship Foundation is to promote the importance of education, self-awareness, and financial literacy for young African-American women that will positively assist in them making informed decisions to thrive academically and socially in their communities.

William C. & Susan A. Delaney Scholarship Fund

Our mission is to provide financial support to African-American students seeking post-secondary educational opportunities enabling them to gain both knowledge and skills which will enable them to achieve their professional goals and allow them to become productive leaders and successful men and women in their communities.


Wouldn't It Be Cool If... Grant
