

## March 21 Questions

Why is it impossible for anyone to go an entire day without sinning?

This passage describes this woman as “immoral,” and the Pharisee—a religious leader—saw her as “a sinner.” Why do we sometimes think some sins are worse than others?

Jesus was unafraid to be around “sinners”—are you unafraid, too? Explain.

Why are “sinners” drawn to Jesus—and why is he drawn to “sinners”?

Have you had an experience with Jesus like the woman did here?

Do you think Jesus is willing to forgive anyone, or are some people too bad or evil? Tell us what you think.

If you’ve received the gift of forgiveness through Jesus, why did you make that choice?

How does Jesus give you hope?

Which character do you relate to most; the woman, the Pharisee, or the other guests? Why?

In the story Jesus told, the woman was like the debtor with 500 denarii, Simon was like the debtor with 50 denarii. Both needed forgiveness. Which debtor do you think describes you best?

We read about the woman who anointed Jesus’ feet—how did her actions show that she had changed and had a new heart?

Even after being forgiven by Jesus, we still struggle with sin—so how does his forgiveness help you deal with the temptation to sin?

What have you done for Jesus recently?

If you ever feel like you’re just too far away from God to even ask for forgiveness, how do you overcome those feelings?

Where do you need the Spirit’s help in continuing to change and become more like Jesus?
