Decoration Day

Just after the Civil War, a holiday known as Decoration Day began to be observed by many. On this day the soldiers who had lost their lives in battle would be remembered and honored with decorations at the cemeteries. This practice led to what is now known as Memorial Day which has been a federal holiday since 1971. It is important to honor the memory of those who have already passed from this life to the next. We can be reminded of great legacies and, perhaps, avoid mistakes.

The lives of heroes should encourage us to live heroic lives. Instead of magnifying the faults and weaknesses of notable people, perhaps we would be better served to recognize their faults but also making the most of their successes and positive traits.

The Scriptures encourage us to honor those who have gone before and to be motivated by their lives. Ephesians 6:2 reiterates the command to "honor your father and mother." The "elders who rule well" should be considered "worthy of double honor" (1 Tim 6:1). Hebrews 12 encouraged us to run the Christian race because "we are surrounded with so great a cloud of witnesses." As we stand upon the shoulders of others, we are expected to finish our course as well as provide strong shoulders for the next generation.

Christian soldiers look forward to being decorated with the crown of victory. Paul looked forward to that day when God would award him. He wrote, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Henceforth there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will award to me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have loved his appearing" (2 Tim 4:8).


Welcome to Lomax!


