A Note From The Pastor May 2021

First, I want to update you on a couple of things going on with the Ad Council. The parsonage sale is proceeding. Luke and Jordan Waltz are preparing to take possession of the house soon. We sold the parsonage for \$125,000. There were a few structure issues found on the inspection that had to be addressed. Along with other expenses deducted we should clear over \$115,000. That money will be used for the Capital Campaign Fund. We have bids for the brick work. There is a great variance in the bids. We are looking into the amounts and hopefully, will be making a decision in the next couple of weeks. We are examining a proposed change to the North steps and wing walls. There has been an idea presented to us that would place a concrete ramp with a brick wall that would wrap around the front to the stairs. We will show you a rendering when we have a better idea of how it may look and what it may add to the project.

The stained-glass interior repairs have been completed. The replacement of the plexiglass and some exterior wood may need to be done in conjunction with the brick work. We want to make the brick repairs around the windows before we place anything new out there.

We are trying to sell the boiler that heated the Fellowship Hall. It was fairly new and still in good shape when the pipes in the floor broke and required a new type of heating and cooling system. Don't forget we still have a pretty extensive "volunteer" list with a lot of different skill levels and talents included.

Merideth informed us at the Ad Council meeting that we have plans to have Vacation Bible School this year. She has a program picked out. We had a fantastic VBS in 2019 because Merideth, Frank, and Isabella put a lot of hours into set up. And it would not have succeeded if so many of you had not worked it or came for support. It is not too early to volunteer to make this year's VBS even better than 2019. She also worked out a deal with Lindsey next door at the library. Lindsey attends Dana UMC and they have agreed to reduce resources purchased by both churches by sharing the sharable items. (CD's, teacher books, props, etc.) This also reduces the cost for each church.

While we were working on the TV's and projection system, we rewired the fluorescence lights in the Chapel. They are now all LED. This gives us more light with about a 85% reduction in the electricity used to light the room. One half of the lights in the Clothes Closet have been converted also. We are continually working to reduce our utility bills.

We have a new janitor, Debbie Fulton. You may notice her around the church at different times. Be sure to introduce yourself when you see her. She works as a senior caregiver and Sunday is a workday for her so she is not able to come to church to meet you all.

Since our last letter, Adult and Children's Sunday School has restarted. Thanks to Alex, Merideth, and Martha who has reconvened Children's Church. We would like to start something for the Jr/Sr High school kids also. We THEY need one of you to lead that class.

It is really good to see many of you back in the church on Sunday mornings. The past 2 Sundays in April saw just above 45 folks worshiping together. We were about 20 more when we were closed down last year. I genuinely enjoy seeing each person who comes on Sunday. I am trying to get outside to greet you all as you leave, so don't be one of those who races to the door when the last prayer is over.

Give me time to go out the Fellowship Hall doors and come around to the front. Those of you who slip out the back should come out the front door so I can see you too! It means a lot to me to be able to greet each of you personally. Seeing people in the church worshiping, talking, smiling, even sleeping (you know who you are) or is a whole lot better than preaching to 4 people and a camera.


ROCK PAINTING Every Tuesday 6:30 p.m.- 8:00 p.m.

GARRISON KEILLOR ON "METHODISTS"

We make fun of Methodists for their blandness, their excessive calm, their fear of giving offense, their lack of speed, and also for their secret fondness for macaroni and cheese.

But nobody sings like them. If you were to ask an audience in New York City, a relatively Methodist-less place, to sing along on the chorus of "Michael Row the Boat Ashore," they will look daggers at you as if you had asked them to strip to their underwear. But if you do this among Methodists, they'd smile and row that boat ashore and up on the beach! And down the road! Many Methodists are bred from childhood to sing in four-part harmony, a talent that comes from sitting on the lap of someone singing alto or tenor or bass and hearing the harmonic intervals by putting your little head against that person's rib cage.

*And if you are hungry, they'll give you tuna salad.

*Methodists believe in prayer, but would practically die if asked to pray out loud.

*Methodists like to sing, except when confronted with a new hymn or a hymn with more than four stanzas.

*Methodists believe their pastors will visit them in the hospital, even if they don't notify them that they are there.

*Methodists usually follow the official liturgy and will feel it is their way of suffering for their sins. *Methodists believe in miracles and even expect miracles, especially during their stewardship visitation programs or when passing the plate.


