At our Voter's Meeting in May, I shared with those in attendance that I will be having surgery at some point for my scoliosis which has progressed to the point where it might begin to impact my heart and lungs due to the amount of curvature that I have. I was referred to a doctor in New York City because his is one of the best in the country who takes only the more severe cases. So, on the one hand, my case is bad enough he will take it, but on the other hand, I am going to have one of the best surgeons you could have. Essentially the surgery will place a rod in my back to straighten my spine. My surgery is set for September 7, and Pastor Bill will be covering things during the month of September as I recover. I will probably be in New York for two weeks.

I share this with you for two reasons... one is simply so you are aware that I will be gone during that time and of course would appreciate your prayers. But the main reason I share it with you is because something my surgeon told me. He suggested that I get back to a routine of exercise that gets my heart beat up several times a week. This is so that my heart and lungs will be better able to handle the surgery and recovery. It got me to thinking. Yes, I should probably already have such a routine, but over the years, I have like many, gotten away from more regular strenuous exercise, but now see the importance of doing so for my long term health. It made me think about our use of God's Word and His Sacraments, but especially the daily use of the Word in devotion and prayer. The truth is, this is as important to our spiritual health as exercise is to our physical health. And I believe even more importantly, our exercise spiritually is even more important because it is about our eternal salvation, and growing in our faith. We need to continue to nurture and stretch our spiritual muscles so to speak by our daily use of God's Word and time in prayer with Him. So, for me, it's time to get back on the bike, and to continue in my spiritual practices! I invite you to do the same! God's rich blessings!

I was working on a sermon at my desk a few days ago and as I came to a stopping point for the morning, I leaned back in my chair and simply stared at the wall behind my computer. Suddenly I observed a tiny ant moving straight up the wall and was headed directly toward the foot of the cross that is hanging there. When the little ant got to the foot, it side stepped and continued its accent. When it encountered the horizontal arm, it hesitated briefly and then crossed on the bottom side of the one-inch thickness of the wood, turned the corner and crossed the two-inch width and finally turned the top corner and came to rest on the top of the arm. As you know, resting is not in an ant's nature and soon it was running back and forth on the top of the arm till it peeked over the edge and appeared to be starting a descent but suddenly it fell to the floor. I did not see anything else of the ant.

Sometimes my thoughts are a little strange but as that ant was going up the wall, I was thinking how that little ant was using his skills to move straight up that wall. He was headed to the foot of the cross and then defying gravity somehow crossing that arm with its feet up and ending of the top. Then I thought about how mankind many times strives, using all their skills, to come to the foot of the cross through their own efforts. In other words, achieve their salvation through their works. The ant got to the cross but couldn't stay there; man might come close but without the Holy Spirit, he neither gets there, nor remains.

I am reminded of Luther's explanation of the 3rd Article, "I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and keeps me in the true faith." When a friend of mine's father was asked by a Baptist preacher if he had taken Jesus as his Savior. The father simply replied, "No. But Jesus my Savior has taken me." There you have it, Jesus did it all. We can trust in Him.


Transfer out of Deb Schinkel to Zion Lutheran, Kearney. Peg made a motion to approve the transfer out and Don seconded it. Motion approved.
