

It has been a joy to watch God work through our journey together. We all know there have been some challenges but many more blessings. We look forward to the days ahead to live out the journey and vision God has for us as the Lord leads us into a new season. When we began our journey here in Collingswood, Psalm 34 was a favorite scripture of mine in the beginning days. I found great strength and direction in God's Word from David's writings in verses from Psalm 34:

I will extol the Lord at all times, his praise will always be on my lips. I will glory in the Lord; let the afflicted hear and rejoice. Glorify the Lord with me; let us exalt his name together. I sought the Lord, and he answered me; he delivered me from all my fears. Those who look to him are radiant; their faces are never covered with shame. This poor man called, and the Lord heard him; he saved him out of all his troubles. The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear him, and he delivers them. Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in him. Fear the Lord, you his holy people, for those who fear him lack nothing. **The eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and his ears are attentive to their cry;** The Lord redeems his servants; no one will be condemned who takes refuge in him.

This passage reminds me of the importance of praising and seeking and trusting God for the future and that the Lord sees and hears his people. David says, God is ever *attentive to our prayers*. I was reminded of something I read from Rick Warren recently about trusting God no matter the circumstances. I found it encouraging and I would like to share with you:


When you can't count on anything else, you can count on God and the promises of God. We have the power of Jesus Christ and the leadership of the Holy Spirit to guide us every day. That's what Paul told his shipmates when they were being battered by a storm in Acts 27. All looked lost. But God had told Paul that they all would be safe. Paul trusted God and told the others: "So take courage, men, because I believe God that it will be just the way it was told to me" (Acts 27:25 CSB). Paul didn't place his faith in the ship or the captain. Paul trusted God. That boat wasn't going to last forever. Paul understood that, but he knew the promises of God would last.

Are you trying to put your trust in a puny lifeboat? Maybe it's your sparkling personality. You're sure that you can get through anything because your personality will shine through. Maybe it's your looks. They've always been the key to your success. You figure you can lean on your looks when troubles hit. Maybe it's your money. You plan to buy yourself out of whatever problem you face. But all of those puny lifeboats will someday perish.

The only safe place to be in the middle of a storm is directly in the center of God's will. Just ask Paul. Acts 27 ends with an incredible comeback—the Bible says "everyone escaped safely to shore" (Acts 27:44 NLT). Like they always have, God's promises came true—even though things might not turn out like we planned or hoped for. When you lean on God's promises during a storm, you won't be the only one who is helped. God just might save the whole ship and those around you too!

Looking back at our journey together, I'm so grateful for how God has been attentive to our prayers together. God has touched many lives. God has touched my life too, as I have served as your pastor over these years, and as we have served together. I thank the Lord as we have partnered together for His will and His glory. Let's trust Him together and see what He has in store for the future in this new season ahead. We love you all and thank you for the privilege of being a part of your family.



The consultant checking work I've been doing via Skype for Andy and Sylvia Grosh and the Kaluli translation team wrapped up at the very end of January with the completion of Genesis 29-50. Another language community in PNG will soon have access to a fair chunk of God's Word, including the entire New Testament, in their own language.

And I'm still working away on the big job of producing interlinear Tok Pisin - Greek New Testament resources for Papua New Guinean translators. That task has been going on for a very long time, and I plan to keep chipping away at it for the foreseeable future. It's the same tedious, detailed, labor-intensive and headache-inducing kind of job that it's always been. Nothing much new to report on that front either, except to say that the interlinear texts for Mark, Luke, Galatians, Colossians, Titus and James have been thoroughly re-

read and revised and printable versions of the four short epistle books are ready for initial distribution to as many reviewers in PNG as I can think of to send them.

Finally, I could tell you again for the umpteenth time that we continue to be amazed at God's generous goodwill towards us, providing for us all we need day after day. But thankfully(!) that's old news too, except to say once more how grateful we are to all of you who pray and give to sustain us in this work. Thanks so much for being so faithful to us all these years!





SEE LIGHT, BE LIGHT

In January 2021, National Youth Poet Laureate Amanda Gorman presented her poem "The Hill We Climb" at the presidential inauguration. The final lines read: "For there is always light, / if only we're brave enough to see it. / If only we're brave enough to be it."

How often we long for light! In recent years we've agonized amid pandemic, angry politics and new awareness of racism. Some have suffered deep sorrow. But Jesus says, "I am the light of the world" (John 8:12) and invites us to turn to Him. God is always bringing light into darkness, through helpers, healers, peacemakers, friends. Sometimes bravery is required to turn our focus from the negative to the positive — to see the light of God.

Jesus also says, "You are the light of the world" (Matthew 5:14, emphasis added) and calls us to brighten the gloom. That requires bravery, as Gorman notes, but as Christians we're urged to look for light not just to make our own lives better but to shine into others' lives too. The Holy Spirit gives us the needed courage — to both *see* and *be* light.
