Dear Siblings in Christ,

I have a friend who lives in Green Bay, WI, and the other day while Facebook showed pictures of youth here going off to Covid's version of the prom in sleeveless gowns with pictures taken in lush, green yards with flowers everywhere, she was still shoveling a bit of snow. Seasons change, one into the other, but sometimes that change is mighty slow.

It's summer! For many of us that means a chance to rest from our toil and head to the beach, the campground, bus trips, the porch, family time and fun hotels. For others of us it's the growing season and time to really get to work; winter's dormant hours, though long, have finished for now and spring has warmed the earth. The pandemic, still with us, has begun to slowly release its hold on us in terms of restrictions.

Perhaps, as the bulk of the population becomes vaccinated and others recover, we'll be free to live our lives again in that long awaited "normal" fashion. In any case, we all need to take a break once in a while... from stress, from routine, from the daily grind. In fact, it's commanded by God – a longstanding expectation and gift from our Creator. We were designed to rest.

Hear the words of the Lord from the passage above. This may be a particularly wearying time in your life, a time of transition, seasonal change that involves more than just the temperatures shifting and the earth blossoming. Transitions are hard, and sometimes they bring with them an awful weight as we wade through them. Waiting for a situation to be over, a test result, a condition to change, etc. can all seem like it will take forever. Adjustment can be rough – and setbacks are common. Rarely are we firmly engaged in a life, or season, that is consistently smooth.

No matter what's going on right now in your life, Jesus invites you, all of you, not just the overachievers, to take a rest. Lay your burdens down at the foot of the cross and breathe deeply into the promise of new life. The Advocate has come! The Spirit of the Lord is active and leading, teaching and healing, accompanying and guiding. Rest in those holy arms, child of God. Give yourself permission to take a break from the stress you're under; no worries, the work of it will be there when you come back. We do much better when we

acknowledge God's invitation to take a sabbath, rest in Jesus, and just stop for a while.



Food Vouchers: Adams County Office of the Aging will once again be distributing Farmer's Market nutrition vouchers to our senior citizens beginning June 5.

The vouchers will be available at the Farmers' Market by the bus station on Carlisle Street in Gettysburg on Saturdays, beginning June 5 and at all the Adams County Senior Centers (East Berlin, Fairfield, Littlestown, McSherrystown, Upper Adams, and York Springs) as well as at the Adams County Office for Aging, 318 W Middle Street, Gettysburg beginning June 7. Those who would like the four \$6 vouchers will need to show a photo ID for proof of Adams County residency and age (they must be born in 1961 or earlier). They must sign a form stating that they meet the income guidelines of no more than \$23,828 per single individual or \$32,227 per married couple. More information is available on the bulletin board.

Stewarding Our Relationships: Rehab, Renew and Repair

Doctors order rehabilitation – intensive exercises and therapy -- for patients to regain muscle strength and flexibility after a serious illness or injury.

The time is right for us to use the same approach for our friendships and family relationships after Covid-19. The worst seems over now that the vaccines are percolating through our nation, and we are entering the summer, when it is comfortable to gather in the relative safety of the outdoors.

It will take serious rehab to repair and renew the friendships and family relationships that Covid-19 forced us to neglect. Hunkered down in our homes for safety, we ceased gathering for friendship, fellowship and recreation – the very activities that keep relationships strong. Churches put worship and social gatherings on hold.

The pandemic's impact on relationships wielded a double whammy: It left us stressed and needing friends at the very time that Covid-19 prevented us from tending to our relationships. It has left us disconnected and hurting.

Keeping in mind that the Covid-19 risk is diminished but not gone, as summer unfolds, you can look for safe ways to rehab, renew and repair your relationships.

Reach out: Go through your list of friends and contact them by phone, email, text – whatever's best. Tell them you missed them and want to get together.

Make plans: Don't put it off. Be creative and find safe ways to get together. Outdoors is safer. Backyard barbecues, coffee at a sidewalk café, a walk, a game of bocce, iced tea on the porch. It's all good.

Every little step you take will help your relationship "muscles" to get stronger, and in the process you'll become healthier as the love, support and joy of friends and family flows into your heart.

The Adopt a Senior initiative is in the discussion phase. We are waiting to see what the COVID task force decides about visiting members before we proceed.

The Mission in Motion committee needs a new leader. Kay Hinkle has served in the capacity for quite a while and has decided to step back from leadership. We need to pray, think, and plan how to proceed with our mission work.

We will plan to have another Coordinating Committee meeting in the near future to continue our work.

Judy and Dona are working on a schedule to visit our senior members and shut ins. They are discussing comfort levels of those they visit due to Covid.

<u>Property-Property Meeting</u> was not held in lieu of having a Spring Clean Up Day. Bob King, Council President and the Property Committee would like to thank the 20 people who came out on the scheduled day, and all week long, to assist in the "Spring Clean Up".

The entire church has been cleaned and many areas have become reorganized. Thank You for the beautiful Spring Plants, and outdoor clean up also.

Also, the property committee will be building rack/shelves in basement to hold wreaths and other decorations.

<u>Mutual Ministry/Constitution Committee:</u>-Jen has received a good number of confirmations resulting from the Child Abuse Clearance notice regarding the need to confirm individual's continuance of the clearance. It is now important to be sure that any person involved in your committee's activities, and who will oversee children in any way, have this required clearance.

Our next scheduled meeting date is June 29, 2021 at 10:00 AM at the church. Social Ministry-Our Next Laundry Love date is <u>Tuesday</u>, June 8 from 5:30-<u>6:30pm</u> at the White Dove Laundromat. Judy ordered Earth Breeze Laundry Sheets from Laundry Love. It is free & it comes 500 in a box. It is detergent in a sheet which turns to soap when put in water. It is earth friendly & you don't have to use liquid detergent which uses bottles which are thrown in the dump. We can also give these to the Food Pantry people.

The next Food Pantry will be held Wednesday, June 2 from 3-6pm.

WELCA had a pie sale on the 22 & 23 of April making 123 Shoo-Fly & Cherry pies. We had a profit after expenses of \$1,120.11 which will be used for upcoming projects in the future. We will also be making chicken pies & freezing for those coming home from the hospital or Homebound or those in need. Cleaning buckets were also made for the Food Pantry patrons.

Pastor's Report

OUTREACH/EVANGELISM

Have been working with Bob King to write a grant for the Open Door Grant, a recent offering from the ELCA for congregations who have, since the pandemic, formulated new and innovative outreach plans to welcome newcomers to the congregation. We're hoping to apply some of our actions and visions for the future around our electronic ministries. They are new to Trinity, innovative, and have resulted in participation of God's children both in and outside our doors.
Am planning to send an upbeat postcard message to inactive members and families who have not participated at Trinity since the pandemic began, announcing clearly that we are open and gathering and offering pastoral care to those who

are still not comfortable coming to in-person activities.

PASTORAL CARE

• Have prepared a letter to go out to families in the congregation addressing the need and desire for pastoral care visits in light of pandemic precautions. The fully vaccinated are now able, according to the CDC and PA Department of Health, to visit one another without posing risk of transmitting the virus. The letter communicates my (and the Adopt-a-Senior volunteers') desire to resume regular visit-ation schedules. The letter also allows for the persons visited to decline a visit at this time. More will be forthcoming about how this unfolds.

• An outdoor fellowship gathering will be held Sunday, May 23rd at Trinity in the parking lot following our May 23/Pentecost service and End of Sunday School Program. The Sebrights have graciously offered to prepare the food for our time of fellowship on that day. Thank you!

• I am hoping, and have brought up on the council agenda, to hold a gathering of some sort in the month of June, or even early July, so that we maintain the momentum of gathering as we work on still fully re-engaging the church family in our life of faith.

OTHER

• Terry's father is still in a hospice facility in Newburgh, NY. We continue to make trips to visit him about every two weeks. We truly appreciate the congregation's prayers and support.

Old Business

- Live Stream/AV Strategy-we have student volunteers willing to help with live streaming services when Jen and Andrea are not available. They will need to learn the technology and we will have them work with the equipment.
- No one has volunteered from the congregation yet to help with the future needs planning of our live streaming and other technology needs. We need to be more specific when talking about this committee and the plans. Another announcement will be made on Sunday. Synod Assembly- Mark is the only person who volunteered to attend via ZOOM and the deadline has passed to find another person.
- New Website-plans are moving forward. Pastor Susan and Jen are working on the content of the new sight and will have it ready for next month's council meeting for us to view.
- Calls to Members Results-Council discussed the recent call results and noted that very positive comments were given from members of our congregation.

New Business

- Learning & Youth-classes in the Fall should include a teacher for the teens/ post Confirmands. This class should be a weekly faith formation class, not just a fun activity.
- Coordination Committee-should work on a social activity for our congregation members in June. A meeting will be announced soon.
- Pastor Susan's installation ceremony-we are waiting until a new Dean is installed at Synod before this can be scheduled.
- Zoom meetings-Bob would like to have a panoramic camera to use with our Zoom meetings, especially when Council meets so that those at home can

see and hear all those who are meeting in person.

- Inactive Members-council discussed a possibility of visiting those who are currently inactive, especially now that we are worshiping in person and CDC guidelines are loosening.
- Benevolence Requests-these are payable through the Endowment Fund and we will work on this and talk about it next month. Discussion followed and a motion to request \$10,000 from the Endowment Holding Account to be transferred to the Benevolence Fund to be used for benevolence requests was made by Stephanie, and seconded by Louise. All were in agreement and the motion carried.
- Other
- CDC Guidelines-an email will be sent to all members to inform them of the new guidelines from CDC and how it affects worship services. Masks are not required if a person is vaccinated in most indoor settings. We will follow the CDC guidelines and ask those unvaccinated to continue to wear masks.
- Council voted to not meet in July-Pastor Susan made the motion and Stephanie seconded it. All were in agreement!
- Our July and August newsletters will be combined.

A motion to adjourn was made by Judy and seconded by Louise, all agreed and the motion carried.
