DB's Dabblings: "Loving, Forgiving and Protecting the Fellowship"

Wynama Arp asked me to read a note she had written to the church to apologize for hurting some of her brothers and sisters. She asked for our forgiveness saying that she realized that sinning against any member hurt the whole church family. Of course, we forgive her, not just because she said she was very sorry, but also because we are commanded to, as we read in the Lord's Prayer:

"Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. . . . For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." (Matthew 6:12-15)

And in Ephesians 4:32: "Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you."

We also thank her for reminding us how important it is to protect the fragile unity found in the fellowship of the Body of Christ.

I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call— one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. (Ephesians 4:1-6)

It Is in the understanding that we all sin, and that our willingness to admit our wrong is as important as our willingness to forgive. It is the natural instinct of our physical bodies to protect its members, especially those most vulnerable like the eyes, so it is with the Body of Christ, the Church. We all look out for each other, protecting, encouraging, supporting, each other; and from time to time saying, "I am sorry I hurt you," followed by, "I forgive you."



Giving Update

Contribution 06/06/2021 \$8,798 (90.7%)

Budget: \$9,700 a week YTD Contribution \$ 216,067 (96%) YTD Budget: \$ 223,100 Building Fund \$319,376 (this is the total amount given since start of Phase 2— the funds given to date have been used for the new roof and new A/C units.) We are making plans to start Phase 3 soon! The section of Graham Street from Green Street through Tarleton Street intersections to a point between Post Office entrance and exit (see map below) is closed due to construction. Be alert for any updates on church activities scheduled for the Family Center, and use extreme caution in the Graham Street area between the church building and the Family Center. The Green Street and Tarleton Street parking lots are still open. The Family Center parking is accessible from Virginia Street, but the nearest crosswalk is at Mason Street.
