Hearing God's Word:



Today in church we will be exploring together, the story of Samuel anointing David in 1 Samuel 15:34 – 16:13. Other scriptures we will be thinking about at church this week include Psalm 20, 2 Corinthians 5:6-17, and Mark 4:26-34.

1 Samuel 16:4-13

⁴ Samuel did what the Lord told him to do. When he arrived at Bethlehem, the elders of Bethlehem shook with fear. They met him and asked, "Are you coming in peace?" ⁵ Samuel answered, "Yes, I come in peace. I have come to make a sacrifice to the Lord. Make yourselves holy for the Lord and come to the sacrifice with me." Then he made Jesse and his sons holy for the Lord. And he invited them to come to the sacrifice. ⁶ When they arrived, Samuel saw Eliab. Samuel thought, "Surely the Lord has appointed this person standing here before him." ⁷ But the Lord said to Samuel, "Don't look at how handsome Eliab is. Don't look at how tall he is. I have not chosen him. God does not see the same way people see. People look at the outside of a person, but the Lord looks at the heart." ⁸ Then Jesse called Abinadab and told him to pass by Samuel. But Samuel said, "The Lord has not chosen this man either." ⁹ Then Jesse had Shammah pass by. But Samuel said, "No, the Lord has not chosen this one." ¹⁰ Jesse had seven of his sons pass by Samuel. But Samuel said to him, "The Lord has not chosen any of these." ¹¹ Then he asked Jesse, "Are these all the sons you have?" Jesse answered, "I still have the youngest son. He is out taking care of the sheep." Samuel said, "Send for him. We will not sit down to eat until he arrives." ¹² So Jesse sent and had his youngest son brought in. He was a fine boy, tanned and handsome. The Lord said to Samuel, "Go! Appoint him. He is the one." ¹³ So Samuel took the container of olive oil. Then he poured oil on Jesse's youngest son to appoint him in front of his brothers. From that day on, the Lord's Spirit entered David with power. Samuel then went back to Ramah.

Family Discussion:

A Question for Adults to ask Children:

What do you think makes a good King?

God was looking for a new King, the old King, Saul was disobedient and full of pride. God wanted somebody who would follow him and live in obedience, who was humble and caring. David did not look like much on the outside but in his heart he knew and loved God. He was a shepherd with a loving heart who looked after his sheep just like God looks after us.

A Question for Children to ask Adults:

What do you think makes a good heart?

Why not share some of the qualities that you most love about God and that we can try to nurture in ourselves.

Dear God,

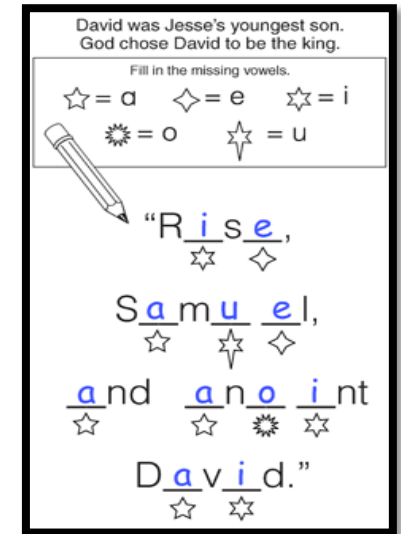

Amen.

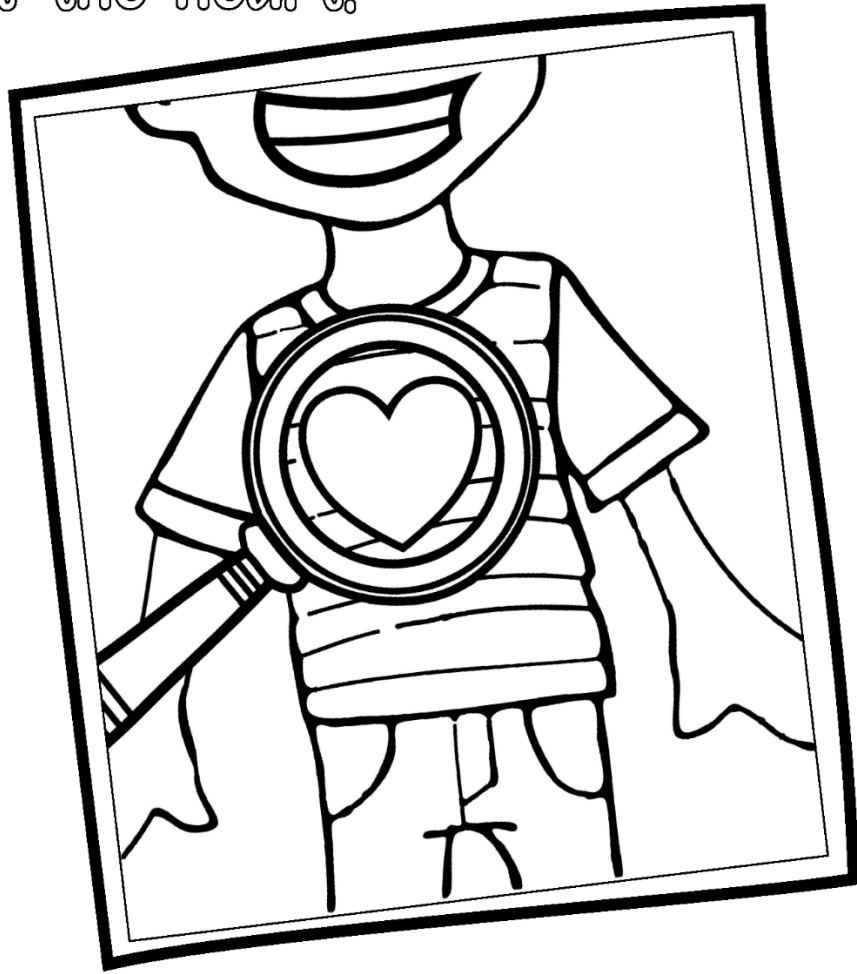


Answer Key:

Family Activities:

Here are some activities you can do together as a family and discussion ideas to explore God's word together.

Family Activity 1:



Use any materials you have to create your own family self portraits, draw, paint or collage yourselves. Once you have finished your self-portraits why not try to draw a heart portrait! You could fill your portrait with words or images that represent the things that are most important to you.

Family Activity 2:

What's inside?: Place mystery items into an empty box or container, take it in turns to reach inside and try to work out what the item is without looking. In the story Samuel was judging the sons of Jesse by how they looked on the outside, but God had a very different way of deciding who would make the best King!



Family Activity 3:



David was not home when Samuel arrived, he was out in the fields watching the sheep. In John 10 we can read about how God is like a shepherd to us. He cares for us, protects us and invites us to trust, follow and listen to Him. Why not try some of these sheep themed activities together.

Applying the Scriptures:

"People look at the outside of a person, but the Lord looks at the heart." (1 Sam 16:7) -- What do you think God wants our hearts to look like? David was described as a man "after God's heart" – how can we make our hearts look like God's? kings of the earth would praise God as Lord! Use it as your prayer this week for our leaders.
