



VANITY OF VANITIES

We are in the process of remodeling our master bathroom. Tore out the 70's-era baby blue molded fiberglass shower surround (apparently stylish at one time), and set our sights on some sort of hip, trendy subway tile. Of course, other outdated features and failing fixtures had to go as well.

We tore out the fiberglass, parts of the walls and ceiling, and chipped out the outmoded tile floor, which we replaced with a cool hexagon tile design. It didn't set right, so THAT was torn out and redone. So far, we've pulled down and replaced the cement backerboard for the new shower three times, and removed and reinstalled the plumbing four times to make corrections. We don't necessarily want perfection, but it has to be just right, you see. Gut and replace everything—including the vanity.

The vanity is appropriately named. We spend a lot of self-absorbed time with it, hoping to become beautiful. In all actuality it does have a practical purpose, since there isn't anyone who wants to go out in public with something dangling out of your nose, or a piece of spinach stuck prominently in your teeth. So there's that.

We searched high and low, and finally settled on a vanity set that was all that and then some. When it arrived (delivered by a Croatian refugee—citizen of the US and heaven—but that's a future article), we unpacked it and found a countertop was chipped. So, a month later, the replacement arrived; all good to go. Literally takes up half the bathroom. Talk about vanity.

Did you know the word "vanity" appears in Ecclesiastes 26 times? Assuming Solomon is the author of the book, he knew something about vanity (though with 1,000 wives and concubines, I'd think he owned well more than 26 vanities). The phrase "vanity of vanities" opens and closes the Ecclesiastical discourse. I'm coming to a new understanding of the vanity of vanities. Installing the plumbing, getting the thing centered just right, figuring and installing the backsplash—so much trouble for the value.

But then, there's the vanity of vanities. Everything we chase after—searching, as the Teacher before us, to discover some meaning in life apart from the gospel-centered relationship we have with God through Jesus Christ. We sing about Christ's sufficiency: lines like You can have all this world, but give me Jesus; All to Jesus I surrender; Jesus I my cross have taken, all to leave and follow Thee; What a beautiful name it is, nothing compares to this.

I find that talk is cheap. I don't know about you, but I have a hard time convincing myself I actually believe what I'm singing when my heart is so easily prone to wander, Lord I feel it. Ok, well, I believe that line. The world is full of all sorts of good things given to us by God; things we greedily pursue as an end to themselves. It leads to the end of ourselves instead, and we come to the Teacher's conclusion—all is vanity. Fear God; keep His commandments. Enjoy Him forever. I constantly have to rid myself of the attachment I have to worldly pleasures, and refocus on the Source of those blessings. It helps to examine myself in the mirror with an air of suspicious realism instead of, well, vanity. Hey—I know just where to do that. - **Brooke Hopkins**

While apologies and forgiveness have been offered, it's sometimes difficult for me to look anywhere other than 'in the closets and under the rug'. Have you heard the saying by pastor Robert Murray McCheyne, "For every look at yourself, take ten looks at Christ."? YES! That's what I need to do and maybe you do too?

This is why I am so excited for Mugs and Muffins this summer, where we will remember together the glorious truths of Romans Chapter 8!


