Father Knows Best

Fathers are known for a lot of things. Hopefully, they are known for their knowledge. We depend on fathers to "show us the way." Our Heavenly Father knows all things and has shown us the way. We will take just a few minutes to learn what it means when we say that God is "all-knowing."

When we say that God is "omniscient," we mean that God is all knowing. That god is omniscient is taught in passages like Isaiah 46:9-10, "remember the former things of old; for I am God, and there is no other; I am God, and there is none like me, declaring the end from the beginning and from ancient times things not yet done, saying, 'My counsel shall stand, and I will accomplish all my purpose." So we see that "Scripture nowhere even hints that anything could be unknown to him. True, the manner in which he obtains knowledge is sometimes stated in striking anthropomorphic language (Gen. 3:9ff.; 11:5; 18:21; etc.), but he nevertheless knows everything. The notion that something should be unknown to him is dismissed as absurd" (Bavinck *RD 2, 192*).

What does God know? God knows everything that could be known. "The most minor and insignificant details (Matt. 6:8, 32); the most deeply concealed things: the human heart and mind (Luke 16:15; Acts 1:24; Rom. 8:27); thoughts and reflections (Ps. 139:2; Ezek. 11:5; Rev. 2:23);...all human action (Ps. 139); hell and perdition (Prov. 15:11); wickedness and sin (Ps. 69:5; Jer. 16:17;); the conditional (1 Sam. 23:10–13; 2 Sam. 12:8; 2 Kings 13:19; Ps. 81:14–15; Jer. 26:2–3; 38:17–20; Ezek. 3:6; Matt. 11:21); and the things of the future (Isa. 41:22f.; 42:9; 43:9–12; 44:7), ...all are known to God. He knows everything (1 John 3:20)" (Bavinck *RD 2*, 192).

God knows everything from beginning to end. He does not just know all the things which might happen. He knows everything that will happen from his eternal perspective. This perfect timeless knowledge should be a comfort to Christians. It is impossible for God to be surprised or to be fickle in his thinking (Num 23:19; Mal 3:6; Js 1:17). Since he knows all things, we never have to wait for God to contemplate or to arrive at a decision.


