The G.I.F.T. Plan

A friendly church is not something that will happen automatically. We need a plan that will encourage us to open our hearts wider and meet some new friends along the way. Try one of the four steps every week. Who will you G.I.F.T. today?

G Greet someone you've never met before.

Get out of your comfort zone. Find someone whose name you don't know and learn it. Welcome them if they've been around for a while, but you just haven't met yet. Or offer to sit with them if they came to church alone.

I Introduce people to each other.

After meeting someone, make sure they meet others too. Connect people who have something in common. Introduce a first-time guest to the pastor, a young person to the youth leader, or kids and their parents to the children's ministries director.

F Follow up with someone you met recently.

Find that person you met a week or two ago and say hi again. Call them by name. Engage in further conversation. Include them in your group of friends.

T Thank someone who did something you appreciate.

Every church has people who volunteer their time and efforts with little, if any, appreciation shown to them. Sometimes it's a simple "way to go" as you pass the sound board. Or a "thank you" to a Sunday schoolteacher for encouraging your child to read the Bible.

Closing

Message

Shepherding the Flock of God

1 Peter 5:1–4 (ESV)

So I exhort the elders among you, as a fellow elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, as well as a partaker in the glory that is going to be revealed: ²shepherd the flock of God that is among you, exercising oversight, not under compulsion, but willingly, as God would have you; not for shameful gain, but eagerly; ³not domineering over those in your charge, but being examples to the flock. ⁴And when the chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the unfading crown of glory.

As long as the church remains far from home, and as long as she continues to exist in the fragility of refining exile, she will need faithful shepherds. And the role of the elders is that of a shepherd.

The Elder's Work

An Elder is to be a shepherd in the flock, and that means he is to feed the sheep the Word of God. He is to tend to their needs with empathy and care. He is to protect them from wolves, from false teaching. He is to guide them away from the wastelands of worldliness into green pastures and quiet waters that their souls might be restored.

The Elder's Conduct

Shepherd them “not under compulsion, but willingly.”

The willing shepherd embraces God's will and makes it his own, as a task freely chosen.

Not for Shameful Gain, but Eagerly

To serve the church for the sake of money rather than the Lord and his people is shameful and akin to fraud. It's one thing to *make* money, another to *serve* it.

Not Domineering but Setting an Example

The office of elder is not for power and control, but an office of ministry and care for the shepherd. And that means we are to be out among the people. The sheep should know their shepherd so that when the shepherd leads them his sheep are glad to follow because they have seen his life.
