Freedom

We like to think we are free people. We Americans declared our independence over 200 years ago. But are we truly free? Perhaps something is still in charge of your life? What rules over you?

John 8:36 teaches us that if the son sets us free then we are free indeed so what if the son has not set us free? If we aren't free in we ever still in and Christ then bondage to something. Romans 6:17-18 described how we have been freed by Christ from sin. Until then, we are struggling with sin as our ruler. What rules your heart? Is It a secret sin? Is It some sin you refuse to acknowledge? As long as you stay in that sinful life, you will be ruled by that sin. Wouldn't it be for better to be ruled by Christ?

Look at what the Spirit wrote by Paul. He said: "Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? But thanks be to God, that you who were once slaves of sin have become obedient from the heart to the standard of teaching to which you were committed, and, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness." In this way, we are truly free. What does it mean to be free? "Freedom is the state that emerges after God has acted to remove all hindrances—social, spiritual (sin and death), economic, and institutional—that block our creational purpose. This purpose is to know, love, worship, and enjoy God forever" (*Lexham Theological Wordbook*). We don't have to be ruled by sin. We don't have to have another day ruined by our sin problem. We don't have to live on fear of being discovered. We can be saved—set free from sin! What is keeping you in bondage to sin? What are you afraid of losing? Isn't Christ far greater than sin?

These meetings challenged folks to study their Bible and gleam from it only what God wants you to do. The Flag We Fly

As Americans, there are few sights that thrill us as much as seeing the "Stars and Stripes" billowing in the breeze over a free nation. When July 4th rolls around, many of us find ourselves rallying around our flag, thankful for the freedom we enjoy in our great country. The common purpose and unity that we feel under that flag should be something that binds us together toward causes greater than ourselves.

Likewise—but in a much more meaningful and important sense—Christians rally together under a common flag: Jesus the Christ. The prophet Isaiah spoke of a time when "the root of Jesse" (a term for the Messiah) would stand as a banner to the people, and the Gentiles would seek Him (Isaiah 11:10). Both Jews and Gentiles would rally to the Messiah, which means this passage was looking forward to a time when the church had been established. In the New Testament, Jesus said that if He be lifted up, He would draw all peoples to Himself (John 12:32), calling them to a true spiritual freedom through sacrificial death on the cross (John 8:32,36). Both Jews and Gentiles rallied to the banner of the Messiah, wiping out all national lines as far as the kingdom of God was concerned (Gal. 3:26-29).

What a beautiful image! Those who seek to know God in truth will come to Jesus through His gospel, and be united together in His kingdom for a common salvation and mission. There is no greater freedom! So while we celebrate our political freedom this July 4th, remember too how Christ has made us free, and rally always to His banner.


