Hearing God's Word:

Today in church we will be hearing the story of David hearing about Saul's death and becoming king as prophesized by Samuel. Other scriptures we will be thinking about at church this week include Psalm 48, 2 Corinthians 12:2-10, and Mark 6:1-13.

David Becomes King

2 Samuel 5:1-5; 9-10

¹Then all the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron. They said to him, "Look, we are your own family. ² In the past Saul was king over us. But you were the one leading us in battle for Israel. The Lord said to you, 'You will be like a shepherd for my people, the Israelites. You will become their ruler." ³ All the elders of Israel came to King David at Hebron. Then he made an agreement with them in Hebron in front of the Lord. Then they poured oil on David to make him king over Israel. ⁴ David was 30 years old when he became king. He ruled 40 years. ⁵ He was king over Judah in Hebron for 7 years and 6 months. And he was king over all Israel and Judah in Jerusalem for 33 years. 9 So David lived in the city with its strong walls. He called it the City of David. David built more buildings around it. He began where the land was filled in on the east side of the city. He also built more buildings inside the city. ¹⁰ He became stronger and stronger, because the Lord of heaven's armies was with him.

Family Discussion:

A Question for Adults to ask Children: Why do you think the people chose David to be King? How do you think David felt when he was chosen?

The Bible describes David as a man 'after God's own heart', David had shown he was a good leader and somebody who really cared for others. Many years before when Saul was King, Samuel had come to visit David and his family, he had anointed David with oil. David knew that a time would come when he would be King, that it was part of God's plan, but it must have been positive to hear that he had been chosen by God's people too.

A Question for Children to ask Adults:

Can you think of a time when you had to lead others?

What do you think makes a good leader??

Dear God,




Thank you for the story of David becoming King. Thank you that this had been your plan for David for a long time.





Family Activity 1:

Family Activity 3:




Just like David we have been chosen to be royal – we are children of the King of Kings!




