And he could work no miracles there

Jesus comes back to his home town of Nazareth, the place where he grew up. It was a small village of a few hundred inhabitants and Jesus was already well known as the (son of the) local carpenter. The contrast between Galilee and Nazareth is striking. In the one he works miracles and heals the woman with the haemorrhage and Jairus's daughter on account of their faith and in the other their lack of faith allows him to heal only a few.

I think the problem is that they thought they knew who Jesus was. Their minds were essentially closed to change. It takes a certain maturity and trust to be able to recognise that the way we see things is wrong and allow new ways of seeing and acting to take their place.

In the second reading today St Paul speaks of the 'thorn in his flesh', of how it is only in his weakness that God is able to act in and through him. It is something that he has learned through bitter experience: relying on his own strength will only get him so far and will never allow God's grace and glory to shine through and for Paul to do truly great things.

There are, I think, two lessons that we might draw from this for our reflections over the summer. The first is to be careful of thinking we know too clearly who God is and where he is trying to lead us. We need to remain agile and able to follow where the master leads if we are to be true to him and to our discipleship.

The second is that our failures, inadequacies and weaknesses are our friends, not our enemies, in the spiritual life. Those occasions when we can do nothing other than turn to God for mercy and compassion are the very ones in which we are most likely to be able to receive his grace and feel its effect in our lives.
