prophesied of Him (in the passage from Matthew 21 above, He was quoting from Psalm 118:22-23), but had also prophesied their rejection of Him. Their rejection of Christ only hurt themselves. Rather than humbling themselves before Him, they determined to stand in His way and reject the very miraculous and marvelous work of God.

Those of us who have trusted Christ as our Savior have obviously not rejected Jesus the way the religious leaders of His day did. But we do sometimes lift our hearts up in pride and insist that our way is better than what God has instructed in His Word. Instead, we should humble ourselves before God and gladly receive His instructions and provision.

Every time we reject God's Word and His truth, we are not harming Him but ourselves.

Our salvation cost God the crucifixion of His Son on the cross. There is no other way to be saved except through Jesus. In Christ we are transformed from the inside out and made a new creation. The heart of stone is removed and we are given a new heart of flesh and a new spirit.

The Cost Of Rejecting God Dr. Paul Chappell

Jesus saith unto them, Did ye never read in the scriptures, The stone which the builders rejected, the same is become the head of the corner: this is the Lord's doing, and it is marvellous in our eyes? Therefore say I unto you, The kingdom of God shall be taken from you, and given to a nation bringing forth the fruits thereof. And whosoever shall fall on this stone shall be broken: but on whomsoever it shall fall, it will grind him to powder. Matthew 21:42-44

The religious leaders and political authorities in Jesus' day thought that by rejecting Him they would be able to keep Him from accomplishing His mission. They thought Jesus needed their approval and acceptance. They were wrong. Because God is all-powerful, He does not need anything from us for His plans to succeed. In his sermon to the superstitious Athenians, the apostle Paul said, "God that made the world and all things therein, seeing that he is Lord of heaven and earth, dwelleth not in temples made with hands; Neither is worshipped with men's hands, as though he needed any thing, seeing he giveth to all life, and breath, and all things" (Acts 17:24-25). God starts out having already won every conceivable battle, and it is folly to stand against Him.

Jesus specifically told those who were rejecting Him that the Old Testament had not only
