## Why Does Humility Create Anxiety?

Being put down or unnoticed and unappreciated is painful. Losing face is painful. Being made little of is painful and the command to be humble under God and to be clothed with humility toward each other makes us anxious.

## Solving the Anxiety Problem

The secret of humility is being able to cast your anxiety on God. The humility Peter commands under God's hand is the peaceful, confident humility that comes because we have cast our anxiety on God with the confidence that he cares for us. When it says that he cares, it means he will not stand by and let things develop without his influence. It means he will act. He will work. Not always the way we would. He's God. He sees a thousand connections we don't see.<sup>1</sup>

Philippians 4:6 says, "*Be anxious for nothing, but in everything, by prayer and supplication, let your request be made known to God. And the peace of God which passes all comprehension will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.*"

## Message

### Humility – The Defining Mark of a True Christian

*1 Peter 5:5–7 (ESV)*

*Likewise, you who are younger, be subject to the elders. Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility toward one another, for “God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble.”<sup>6</sup> “Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time he may exalt you,<sup>7</sup> casting all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you.*

### Humility Is Essential to the Christian Life

Three times the command comes in one form or another.

1. Verse 5a: “Younger men, be subject [i.e., be humble toward] to your elders.”
2. Verse 5b: “All of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another.”
3. Verse 6: “Humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God.”

### Humility in All Church Relationships

By definition, a church is a gathering of the humble. Disciples are confident of their worth, since we know that God created us in his image and valued us enough to send his Son for us. Yet every believer is aware of his sin and need. Every disciple has repented, and when we repent, we both confess particular sins and admit that we are selfish and rebellious to the bone. Knowing that we are incapable of self-reform, we trust in Christ.

### How Do Humility and Not Being Anxious Relate?

“Humble yourselves . . . casting your anxieties on him.” Casting your anxieties on God is an expression of humility.

Humility is the risk of not being noticed, not being appreciated, not being praised, and not being rewarded. Lowliness runs the obvious risk of being looked down on.
