Hearing God's Word:

Today in church we will be exploring the story of dancing King David in 2 Samuel 6:1-5; 12b-19. Other scriptures we will be thinking about at church this week include Psalm 24, Ephesians 1:3-14, and Mark 6:14-29.

Dance with All Your Might

² Then David and all his people went to Baalah in Judah. They took the Ark of the Covenant of God from Baalah in Judah and moved it to Jerusalem.
⁵ David and all the Israelites were playing all kinds of musical instruments before the Lord. They were made of pine wood. There were lyres, harps, tambourines, rattles and cymbals. ¹² The



people told David, "The Lord has blessed the family of Obed-Edom. And all his things are blessed. This is because the Ark of the Covenant of God is there." So David went and brought it up from Obed-Edom's house to Jerusalem with joy. ¹³ When the men carrying the Ark of the Covenant of the Lord had walked six steps, David sacrificed a bull and a fat calf. ¹⁴ Then David danced with all his might before the Lord. He had on a holy linen vest. ¹⁵ David and all the Israelites shouted with joy. They blew the trumpets as they brought the Ark of the Covenant of the Lord to the city. ¹⁷ David put up a tent for the Ark of the Covenant. Then the Israelites put it in its place inside the tent. David offered whole burnt offerings and fellowship offerings before the Lord. ¹⁸ When David finished offering the whole burnt offerings and the fellowship offerings, he blessed the people in the name of the Lord of heaven's armies.

Family Discussion:

<u>A Question for Adults to ask Children</u>: Why do you think David celebrated and danced when the Ark of the Lord was brought to Jerusalem?

The Ark of the Covenant was built to carry the stone tablets, containing the laws that God had written for God's people. God gave instructions to Moses of how it should look (Exodus 25) and you can read about it being constructed in Exodus 37. In 1 Samuel 4 we read about how the Philistines captured the Ark of God, it caused so many problems for them that they returned it and for many years it was kept in the house of a man called Abinadab.

When the Ark of the Lord was brought back to Jerusalem it was a reminder that God was with his people and that God's promises and agreements with his people had not changed.

A Prayer to Say Together:




Dear God,





Here are some activities you can do together as a family and discussion ideas to explore God's word together.

Family Activity 1:

Family Activity 2:


David loved to worship and praise God, in his Psalms he wrote about worshipping God with many different instruments.


Why not create one of these musical instruments from recycled materials?

- Fill some empty bottles or jars with different amounts of water, tap them with pencils or spoons and see what different sounds you can make.

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

