Essentials

Around 14 years ago a lady called the church house and asked me what we believed. I wasn't sure just what to tell her in a brief phone call, but that brief and awkward conversation helped me to realize how important it is to be able to know what you believe and share it with others quickly.

1 Peter 3:15 commands us to "sanctify the Lord Christ in your hearts, and always be ready to make a defense to all who ask you a reason concerning the hope in you." Biblical doctrine is essential. It is also essential for us to be able to know and be able to locate the relevant passages which teach particular biblical doctrines so that we might responsibly share them with others.

Beginning this Sunday morning, our sermons will focus on familiarizing ourselves with one main passage for the main doctrines of Christianity. Here is our tentative schedule: 1) What is the Bible? 2 Tim 3:15-16; 2) Is There a God? Heb 3:4; 3) Who Is Jesus? Heb 1:1-4; 4) Who Is the Spirit? Jn 14; 5) What is Sin? 1 Jn 3:1-10; 6) How Can I Be Saved? Acts 2; 7) What is the Christian Life About? Rom 12; 8) How Do We Sing? Eph 5:19; 9) How Do We Have the Lord's Supper? 1 Cor 11; 10) How Do We Pray? 1 Tim 2; 11) How Do We Give? 1 Cor 16; 12) How Do We Preach? 2 Tim 4; 13) What Happens at the End? 2 Pet 3.

I hope this new sermon series will help us all to be familiar with important Bible doctrines and then also to be able to share reasons for our faith as we have opportunities to talk with others.

Choose to 'Do Well'

While watching a movie entitled *An Old Fashioned Christmas* on the Hallmark Channel, I scribbled down an outstanding observation a character made about choosing a path in this world.

In this movie, which is based on a story set in the 1880's by Louisa May Alcott, one young man took a house guest out to a pub and got him drunk. Later at the dinner table, with the entire family gathered around, his behavior was brought to light. The young instigator played the event off by saying, "It's all part of becoming a man!" His mother profoundly said, "It depends on what kind of man one wishes to become."

The lesson in this simple statement is powerful. What we become depends a lot upon the choices we make. As God told Cain in Gen. 4:7, "If you do well, will you not be accepted? And if you do not do well, sin lies at the door. Its desire is for you, but you should rule over it."

Cain didn't amount to much, because he didn't rule over his desire to sin. Like the young man in the movie, if we accept sin as a "rite of passage," we are quite literally choosing sin, and a path that leads away from God and toward destruction.

If you want to become the kind of person God wants you to be, choose to "do well." Refuse sin and live for Jesus!
