How Are You Special?

You are a person. You are special. Have you ever wandered why? Why are you a special person? Are you special because of what you can do or are you special because of what you have to offer or are you special just because you are?

You are valuable because you exist. God created humanity in his own image (Gen 1:27). All of humanity—this includes you—are image bearers. Humans reflect God's glory—or at least that is their purpose. We struggle with hiding God's glory with our own selfishness—that is what the Bible describes as sin. To fall short of God's glory or identity (Rom 3:23).

Human identity as image bearers does not depend on personal capabilities or functionality. Every person is an image bearer despite what he or she may be capable of—good or bad. As God's image bearers, every person has value. This value is not to be attacked or diminished by oneself or by someone else. Every person has the right to life. This value is we can say that every person has been "endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable." This value is why you are valuable.

Your identity is also determined by God. God did not make you to be a catfish or a gorilla. God made you to be his image bearer—a human person that is either male or female. Gender identity and the creation of humanity is linked closely in Scripture's record of creation. Genesis 1:27 says, "So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them." If God created you as a man, you can glorify God as a man. If God created you as a woman, you can glorify God as a woman. The two genders complement one another for God's glory and their own good.

- 4. Lack of Proper Training in the Lord (Deut. 6:5-9).
- 5. Lack of Proper Teaching (Isaiah 59:2).
- 6. Lack of Proper Priorities (Matt. 6:24).
- 7. Lack of Interest (Romans 16:1-2).

How do we respond as parents?

- 1. Fill our kids with Bible knowledge!
- 2. Prepare our children for combat/ challenges!
- 3. Protect their hearts & minds!
- 4. Train our kids up in the nurture & admonition of the Lord.
- 5. Teach our children the proper portrait of God!
- 6. Model proper priorities of life!
- 7. Be consistent with words & actions! We must understand the challenges our children are facing. Our children need us to respond so they can remain resilient!
