A little over 10 days ago, a friend of mine and I were driving around some of the residential areas in town and our conversation turned to lamenting how most of the lawns were showing a lot of stress. Everywhere we looked, the lawns were showing yellow areas instead of dark green, brown areas where there was a lack of moisture. Even where the homeowner had a well laid out underground sprinkler system, the effects of heat and lack of moisture were quite evident. Man's inability to manage the effects of nature had drawn up short.

On the next Friday evening and early Saturday morning all of that changed. God brought rain to our town and surrounding area. Ten days later, with several showers that occurred in that time frame, our community looked altogether different. The brown spots along with the yellow areas had almost disappeared from the yards. You began to hear comments in the coffee shops like, "You just can't beat God's water. It's so much better than ground water." You know what, those comments are absolutely correct. The water that falls from the sky, God's water, is so pure and gives our vegetation what it needs.

God's water for the soul is His Word. His pure Word gives us the nourishment that our souls thrive on. There is no substitute. When we deprive ourselves from hearing, reading and meditating on it, we begin to be like a weak and dying lawn.
