### **Is God Perfect?**

Most Christians would immediately answer yes! God is perfect. One of the classic descriptions of God's perfection was from Boethius who wrote that God is "That then which comprehendeth and possesseth the whole fullness of an endless life together." Bavinck said "God is the real, the true being, the fullness of being, the sum total of all reality and perfection, the totality of being, from which all other being owes its existence. He is an immeasurable and unbounded ocean of being; the absolute being who alone has being in himself."

What do we mean when we say that God is perfect? What does God's perfection mean to us? God's perfection is described in Scripture as his fullness, boundlessness, and perfection. God is perfect, and his people are expected to pursue that perfection in their lives (Matt 5:48). God is perfect life. He has "life in himself" (Jn 5:26). He is the God who simply "is" (Ex 3:14). God is "perfect in knowledge" (Jb 37:16). God's ways are "perfect" (Ps 18:30). His work is "perfect" (Deut 32:4). Jesus said that he is "the life" (Jn 14:6). All the "fullness of God" was pleased to dwell in the Son (Col 1:19). Since God is perfect, he does not and cannot change in his essence (Js 1:17), in his will (Mal 3:16) or his mind (Num 23:19-20).

God's perfection is also seen in his self-existence. There was no "before God." No one created God. God is the necessary first cause of all contingent things. God made all things and is not limited to physical habitation (Acts 17:24). God is not served by humanity because he requires service to exist (Acts 17:25). Instead, out of his infinite nature, God makes everything without losing anything (Acts 17:26). This God is perfect. Bavinck wrote said "As One who exists of and through and unto himself, he is the fullness of being, the independent and supremely perfect Being." There is, therefore, no "potential" in God as there is potential in us. He is already perfect—the fullness of life.

What does God's perfection mean to us? First, since God is perfect, we know that we can and do depend upon his perfection for our lives. Second, we know that God will always do that which is best since he is perfect and there are no weaknesses within him. Third, we understand that we should seek him as the ultimate reality. He is perfect goodness, beauty, and truth. Finally, we must adore him. Adoration of God is necessary because he alone is perfect and therefore worthy of worship.







## Boo's Belyeu

With the Olympics in progress I began to wonder what athlete had overcome the most. When I googled it several came up, Wilma Rudolph jumped out at me. She was born prematurely 4.5 pounds in 1940 the 20<sup>th</sup> child of 22 siblings. As a young child she had measles, whooping cough, was paralyzed by polio, many doctors felt she would never walk again. She contracted both scarlet fever and double pneumonia both of which almost killed her. Rudolph was fitted with metal leg braces at age 9. By the time she was 12 she had regained her ability to walk and took up athletics. Rudolph found her calling in track and field she made her Olympic debut in 1956 Melbourne games. At the 1960 Rome Olympics she did the extraordinary. She won 3 gold medals breaking the world record in the 100 meter final, breaking the Olympic record in the 200 meter final, and breaking the world record in the 4 by 100 final. Rudolph summed it up best in her most popular quote: "My doctor told me I would never walk again, my mother told me I would. I believed my mother." The obstacles of life can wear us down physically and spiritually. Of course the most important is our spiritual life. 1st John 5:4 "4 For everyone who has been born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith." 1st Tim. 6:12 "12 Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called and about which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses."

In 1 Timothy 4:12 it states, "Let no one despise your youth, but be an example to the believers in word, in conduct, in love, in spirit, in faith, in purity." As we think about this verse, we often think about how many say our youth group has members who are the future of the church.
