Important information from the Elders continued from last month

Here are some passages we encourage you to read to learn what each function entails and how each is demonstrated in the church. We ask that you prayerfully consider what God's Word teaches about church membership and leadership.

<u>Members</u> - if we are indeed a part of the church, i.e. those that have a living relationship with Jesus Christ and are living out the gospel to which they are called (more on that in a future Holy Post); we are responsible for our own growth and maturing in Christ (see *Ephesians 4:13 and Hebrews 5:14*). We are also called on to examine ourselves before the Lord (see *2 Corinthians 13:5*), assemble together in order to encourage each other (see *Hebrew 10:25*), to present ourselves as workmen (see *2 Timothy 2:15, 20-21*), and to know who we are in the body (see *1 Corinthians 12:14-26*).

<u>Deacons</u> - initially in the church these people were selected by the congregation, as instructed by Apostles in Acts 6 (first time deacons were selected). Then with greater detail as described in 1 Timothy 3:8-13, by the general members. Note that these individuals should also already be doing the work, and be evaluated based on what the members see. *NOTE*: there has been much discussion throughout church history concerning the role of women as deacons, centered around Paul's inclusion of verse 11 and other Scripture; here at the Christian Church of Los Alamos, we take the position that women can be deacons, based on this passage and others. If you have any questions, please ask one of the elders.

<u>Elders</u>-in the church these men were/are appointed: initially by Paul and Barnabas in the cities they visited and established churches (see Acts 14:23). Then by Titus under Apostle Paul's direction (see Titus 1:5), and since then by God making it a man's heart's desire, through the members by application of 1 Timothy 3:1-7 and Titus 1:6-9. These are men that are recognized as already doing the work mentioned in these passages. Other functions that are either commonly referred to by the church universal, or that we have established here at the Christian Church, are:

<u>Pastor -</u> This is a term that has widespread use in the church. The word translated pastor, <u>poimeen</u>, is used only 1x in the New Testament and is found in Ephesians 4:11. These individuals were given as a gift from God to the body for instructing the body in the Word of God.

¹¹ And He gave some as apostles, and some as prophets, and some as evangelists, and some as pastors and teachers,

Here at the Christian Church, we have two elders that have a pastor/teacher role. We support them financially (see 1 Timothy 5:17) so that they can devote their time to the primary tasks of teaching and preaching the Word to the church members.

<u>Ministry Area Coordinators</u> - those that coordinate activities that benefit the body. 1 Peter 4:10. ¹⁰As each **one** has received a *special* gift, employ it in serving **one another** as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.

The vision for any specific body comes from God, conveyed by the elders as they gain insight and understanding by relating to the body. They engage in prayer, study of God's Word, evaluating the instruction needed, and coordinating meeting the needs of the body with the deacons, and in our case MACs. We are interdependent on each other. Ultimately, each of us is responsible for our growth in Christ; but we do it collectively. It isn't "me and Jesus." It is Jesus, through His Spirit that indwells us, and His use of others that helps shape and guide us; because it is for His glory, not ours. In reaching a dysfunctional world, we need each individual in the body actively being a part of the brotherhood so that the world can behold the Bride of Christ.
