



FALL WOMEN'S MINISTRY BIBLE STUDY: JUDGES THE STENCH OF SIN IS NO MATCH FOR THE GRACE OF GOD

In October of 2019, our family moved into a new home. Moving tends to be a little chaotic. When half of your possessions are packed and you can't remember which half and you can't find what you need...and there's paperwork and a whole list of to-do's from the township, which our excellent real estate agent, Vic Illnicki, who is a member of NPC, has always taken care of. However, during this move, one of the township's requirements, a dye test, failed inspection on the home we were selling and revealed a block in our sewer line.

Ugh! Yuck! Needless to say, I was feeling a bit of stress and frustration about the delay in the process, but we called a plumber; they snaked the line and it all worked out.

Less than two weeks pass and I walk to the basement of our new home to check the progress of the laundry and see that water is coming up out of the drain in the floor. As the laundry drained from the washer, the puddle on the floor expanded more and more. Our new home's sewer line was also blocked.

Ugh! Yuck! And maybe a tear or two. Really?! Again?!

I wonder if God has ever thought, "Ugh! Yuck! Really?! Again?!" in conjunction to His people and our distrust of Him, our disobedience. Of course, He's never surprised, and in Exodus, He describes

Himself as "a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness," but I imagine that His heart still breaks each time we live into the stench of our sin rather than living into the pleasing aroma of trust and obedience.

I wonder if He felt His heart break because of my very own disobedience during these sewage struggles as I worried about and tried to control everything rather than trusting Him. Did I mention that I actually drove to the McCandless township building to ask them to do our failed test again because they must have done it wrong? I worried, then I tried to fix it, then I worried some more.

I'm sure that my own sin has a stench that is even more putrid than I could know or imagine; yours does too. But God is SO GOOD! He doesn't hold His nose and run in the opposite direction. He invites us to draw near. In fact, He commands us to come to Him, cast our cares upon Him and find relief and rest. He takes our sinful stench, washes us, makes us pure and dresses us in Christ's obedience. And, as if all of that was not enough, He places the Spirit of Jesus within us and promises to NEVER leave us or forsake us. WOW!!! Take that in for a moment. Now consider the book of Judges.

Judges is a book filled with stories of man's inability to keep God's law. It is filled with acts of violence that are hard for us to fathom. The book of Judges is filled with the stench of man's sin. If we focus on those acts of violence and man's heinous heart while reading Judges, it makes us want to hold our nose and run in the opposite direction. But, what if we focus our eyes on God and even fix our eyes on Jesus as we read? Then we will see "a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness".



We will recognize our complete inability to keeps God's law, our total depravity and dependence upon Him and we will see His patience with and faithfulness to His people. He doesn't give up on His own.

"Time after time you read of (Israel) being in hard captivity for their sins, time after time you read of God delivering them; and yet a few short years and it seems to have been all forgotten. The Lord gave

them judges and kings, and priests and prophets and ministers, and preachings and warnings; and yet their history, with a few exceptions, is a history of unbelief, and backsliding, and transgression, and crime—down to the very day when they crucified the Lord Jesus Christ Himself! "(J.C. Ryle)

NEW CHILD CHECK-IN SYSTEM

TEMPORARY VOLUNTEERS FOR EDUNATIONS NEEDED

Our partner agency that provides education to remote villages in Sierra Leone (EduNations) needs your help contacting current donors and helping them transition to their new giving platform. Maintaining their giving is essential for the long-term health of this partner organization, and we are looking for some North Park people to help out.

You will receive training from EduNations and be given the essential information to walk them through the steps. At present, we anticipate the time window

MISSIONARY OF THE MONTH

In August of 2021, Emily transitioned her ministry to serve in a new region. She is now working in North Africa as an English teacher at a university. Out of the millions of people in this country, it is estimated there are only 500 indigenous believers, with only 1/3 of those believers attending a church.

As a result, there is a great need in this country, yet many in this country do not understand their need. Emily will also live with a team of other teachers who intentionally build relationships with students and demonstrate the love of the Father. The work is necessary, yet it can progress slowly. 
- To cultivate good relationships with the people despite potential curfews or restrictions.

MISSIONS—YEAR IN REVIEW

Thank you for your generosity over the past year. It has allowed us to maintain support for our missionaries throughout a difficult season. In addition, we have been able to invest in our long-term partners in fairly significant ways. For instance, we donated toward a matching campaign to raise money for a new traveling ultrasound to be used in Russia. We gave assistance money to Reflecting God's Grace Ministries (led by Maria Allewelt), which allowed them to support a number of women and children who were financially strained for food and lodging during this season. The CCO position at Gateway was maintained throughout this year, keeping a quality staff person in place for this fall when the church hopes to return to meeting on campus and maximizing its impact with students. We also contributed to a church plant in Haiti in conjunction with Livingstone Reformed Mission, and this is not all that we've done.

SOMETHING'S COMING...

This September, we look forward to telling you more about a journey that a number of us have been on for the past year practicing a few simple yet profound disciplines. In some ways, I feel like I have been holding onto a big secret as I have seen others and myself stretch what we thought was possible and found ourselves responding to God's invitations in surprising ways.

What is this secret? It is that practicing the disciplines of prayer, blessing, and living from the vibrant life of Christ, in close community with others, has spurred me to share Christ's love with others in ways that genuinely surprise me.

Before intentionally focusing on these disciplines with a group of peers, I had never bought spontaneous gifts for anyone, though I often admired those who had the knack for buying just the right one. But as we devoted ourselves to praying for opportunities to share Christ's love for others, suddenly options for gift-giving became much more apparent. The neighbor's new dog could use a chew toy. Those leftover Easter Lilies hanging around the church exit would bring cheer to my isolated elderly neighbors. A phone call with a former neighbor seemed to take a meandering turn when he started talking about how much he liked tea with honey instead of coffee. Rather than checking out of the conversation, I started making plans of how to get tea and honey on the next grocery list. Suddenly, it didn't seem so hard to think of fitting gifts for people. When I started praying for such opportunities, they started popping up everywhere.

This is just one example of how I have seen myself change through this journey. I have seen surprising things happen when six of us practiced these together. Imagine what can happen if we implement them as a church? The gates of Hell won't be able to contain it (Matthew 16:18). I look forward to hearing your stories in the months to come.

This month, we start with the first step, which is prayer. We start there because without God, all human effort is empty and worthless. The prophet Isaiah called human flesh as good as grass (Isaiah 40:6). Without God being in it, all our best efforts will wither like dying flowers. We come to the brokenness, isolation, and pain of our world like the boy pulled from the 5,000 with only five loaves and two fish. We have very little with which to address the hunger of the world, and yet God has the power to multiply it beyond our imaginations. It is God who can use our words to inspire, our gifts to convey love, our meals to extend welcome, and our service to help. Thus, we start with, and never move on from, prayer. As we end September, we are going to invite you to join us in praying proactively for God to use each of us as he sees fit.

Are you curious about what will happen? If our experience is any quide, you'll discover God doing things through you that you never expected, and when that happens I hope you start telling people about it.
