You shall be a fugitive and a wanderer on the earth."

- 2. Why do you think Cain took his anger out on Abel and not on God?
- 3. What had Abel done to provoke Cain?
- 4. Might we provoke people to anger for the same reason?

And the LORD put a mark on Cain, lest any who found him should attack him. ¹⁶ Then Cain went away from the presence of the LORD and settled in the land of Nod, east of Eden.

- 1. What do you think Cain's life was like after he left God's presence?
- 2. The word "Nod" here means "wandering." How does this help answer the previous question?
- 3. What does this tell us about the result of a life like Cain's? See Proverbs 4:19, Ephesians 4:17-18.
- 4. Cain had a wife and descendants (Genesis 4:17-22). But Adam and Eve had another son named Seth (Genesis 4:25), who was the ancestor of Noah (Genesis 5:3-28). Only Noah and his family survived the flood God brought on the earth (Genesis 7:7). Why do you think God chose to continue the human race through Seth and not Cain?
