Special

General Revelation

 This revelation is not a general- everybody can see it- type of revelation.

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"Anointed One" is used.

 The term Messiah not used in the Old Testament but a fully developed doctrine by the second century BC.

Messianic theme is found throughout the Old Testament.

- From the line of David.
- Servant of God.
- An end-times deliverer.
- A redeemer from sin.

Definition

"The Messiah is the eschatological, royal, Servant of the Lord, springing from the Davidic dynasty, who is consecrated by God to provide redemption from sin, bring deliverance for Israel, rule the world, and establish a kingdom of peace, justice, and righteousness."

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Hengstenberg

Ernst Wilhelm Hengstenberg (1802-1869)

He believed that the work that God did within the world was done primarily through specific divine interventions.

Essentially he saw miracles, such as the incarnation, as major events with little long term effects.

 He viewed OT Messianic prophecies as puzzle pieces that one would need to go to the NT to see the picture of the puzzle so it could be put back together the way it should be.

Von Hoffmann

Christian Konrad von Hoffmann- (1810-1877)

Essentially focused more on history as being Messianic than Scripture. The history that Israel experienced was Messianic in and of itself.

The whole story, Scripture and history, become Messianic.

"It is a long way between the death of an animal whose skin covered [man's] nakedness, and the death of the Son of God whose righteousness covers [man's] sin. Yet these are like the beginning and the end of the same journey."

He took many of the biblical stories to be less realistic that previous generations. Nile blood was not actually blood.

 Since the OT was simply a history, then MP within it could not be used to defend the validity of Christianity. History could but prophecy could not. History, not miracles, defends Christianity.



Proposition #1:

Prophecy As Prediction and Identification

 The OT can be used to look forward to events as well as to correctly ID events (or people) that have already come.

"The OT not only predicts the coming of a Messiah; it also describes and identifies that Messiah."

Jewish Views of MP

Jewish rabbis have quite a robust idea of what are Messianic prophecies.

Mishnas, the Talmud, etc all show the vast amount of research that has been down on the matter.

Prophecy or Parallel?

There are many OT characters that we can draw parallels from in the life of Christ.

 They are not meant to be prophecies about who Christ would be or what he would do, just a parallel to see God's plan throughout history.

Moses, Joseph, David, etc.



It was common OT practice to have characters point out parallels to previous characters to validate there actions or words.

 Jewish readers would have been very familiar with parallels in the OT.

Prophecy Primer

- The Bible is full of prophecies.
- There are countless ways in which people interpret prophecies.
- Jonah.
- Biblical prophecy is often designed to see in hindsight.

Scripturally, the gift of prophecy usually has much less to do with foretelling the future and focuses on stating the truth, i.e.

Biblical prophecies, especially Messianic prophecies, are often best seen looking back over past events.

Remember that God could have made things crystal clear, if he willed it. He obviously did not. The "mystery" of the Gospel and Scripture is an important aspect.

Looking Forward?

Prophetic Purpose

 The primary purpose of Biblical prophecy is to call people to God. Sometimes to initially call them, sometimes to call them back.

There is always a godly and intentional purpose to prophecy.

What Make Them

Specificity

Time between prophecy and fulfillment.

Accuracy

Source of Prophecy

The existence of prophecy begs the question: Where does it come from?

It would follow that in order for a future event to be foretold, there would have to be foreknowledge of events that would take place.

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 Therefore, we see that prophecy has to be something that is intentionally given to a person by some omniscient force.

There has never been an archaeological discovery that has disproved any events found the in OT.

Dead Sea Scrolls

- Tel Dan Stele- earliest mention of "house of David."
- Cyrus Cylinder- Talk of exiles being allowed to return.

Hezekiah Tunnel- Inscription and tunnels described in Bible.

Historical

Many events that we have recorded in the OT are corroborated by histories of other nations and cultures.

Worldwide flood

The Prophecies

The Stoner Study Other OT prophecies.

The Stoner Study

Study done with over 600 students looking at eight MP from the OT and assigning a very conservative probability to each of them.

The probability is of each one happening to a single individual.

MP: Micah 5:2

But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days.

Fulfilled: Luke 2:4-6

And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth.

Probability:

2.8 x10⁵

Methodology

"The best estimate which we can make of this comes from the attempt to find out the average population of Bethlehem, from Micah down to the present time, and divide it by the average population of the earth during the same period. One member of the class was an assistant in the library so he was assigned to get this information. He reported at the next meeting that the best determination of the ratio that he could determine was one to 280,000. Since the probable population of the earth has averaged less than two billion, the population of Bethlehem has averaged less than 7,150. Our answer may be expressed in the form that one man in 7,150/2,000,000,000 or one man in 2.8 x 105 was born in Bethlehem."



Interesting Facts

In the Masoretic texts (the Scripture the Jews use today) the phrase "they have pierced" is changed to the word "like a lion." It only requires a very minor change to one letter.

Then he released for them Barabbas, and having scourged Jesus, delivered him to be crucified. Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the governor's headquarters, and they gathered the whole battalion before him. And they stripped him and put a scarlet robe on him, and twisting together a crown of thorns, they put it on his head and put a reed in his right hand. And kneeling before him, they mocked him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" And they spit on him and took the reed and struck him on the head. And when they had mocked him, they stripped him of the robe and put his own clothes on him and led him away to crucify him.

7 weeks and 62 weeks- agreed to be "weeks of years"

483 years from 445BC, taking into account 360 day years = 32AD

Fulfilled Facts

Temple destroyed in 70AD. Daniel 9 states that the Messiah will come prior to the destruction of the temple. The Messiah had to come prior to 70AD. • Even if the temple is rebuilt, the Messiah must come from the tribe of Judah. All tribal records were lost in 70AD.

MP: Daniel 9:27

And he shall make a strong covenant with many for one week, and for half of the week he shall put an end to sacrifice and offering.

Fulfilled: History

Friday has never been a good option for the crucifixion.

 This verse seems to indicate that the end of the sacrificial system will happen mid-week.

 If the crucifixion happened in 32 AD, Passover would have timed with a Wednesday or Thursday crucifixion!

What Are The Chances?

As you can see from the Stoner study, the probabilities of just a few prophecies are overwhelmingly small.

Imagine if we were to assign a probability to each of the others that we have looked at.

 If the evidence we see in Scripture does not lead to God, then that is a problem for those that seek Him.

 If the evidence we see in Scripture does lead to God, then that is a problem for those that reject him.

Why Does This Matter?

God gave us an amazing amount of evidence throughout Scripture, history, and written on our hearts of his existence and involvement in our lives.

 That evidence can be general revelation (scientific, logical, mathematical) or through special revelation (the Bible).

As Josh McDowell so succinctly put it, "Evidence demands a verdict."

How'd The Jews Miss It?

The first thing that we have to remember is that they did not all

Luke 2:25-35

Now there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon, and this man was righteous and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. And he came in the Spirit into the temple, and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him according to the custom of the Law, he took him up in his arms and blessed God and said, "Lord, now you are letting your servant depart in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation that you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel." And his father and his mother marveled at what was said about him. And Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is appointed for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign that is opposed (and a sword will pierce through your own soul also), so that thoughts from many hearts may be revealed."

Luke 256-38

And there was a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived with her husband seven years from when she was a virgin, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She did not depart from the temple, worshiping with fasting and prayer night and day. And coming up at that very hour she began to give thanks to God and to speak of him to all who were waiting for the redemption of Jerusalem.

John 1242

Nevertheless, many even of the authorities believed in him, but for fear of the Pharisees they did not confess it, so that they would not be put out of the synagogue;

John 342

Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. This man came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him."

MP: Isaiah 53:1, 6:10

Who has believed what he has heard from us? And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?

Make the heart of this people dull, and their ears heavy, and blind their eyes; lest they see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their hearts, and turn and be healed."

Fulfilled: John 12:37-40

Though he had done so many signs before them, they still did not believe in him, so that the word spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: "Lord, who has believed what he heard from us, and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?" Therefore they could not believe. For again Isaiah said, "He has blinded their eyes and hardened their heart, lest they see with their eyes, and understand with their heart, and turn, and I would heal them."

What Does This Mean For Us?

 The knowledge of these fulfilled prophecies means that our faith in Christ is strengthened by the evidence that we have before us. Fulfillment of prophecy will never get us to a personal relationship with God but rather it will help to "fill the potholes on the road to salvation.



Secondly

 The reality of the fulfillment of the prophecies should make us all the more bold to share the Good News of the NT. It shows the corroboration of the OT with the NT and the supernatural influence in both.

 We can boldly stand on the evidence of God, his plan, and his love while we share our faith with others.
