

# **Servant Thoughts**

As I write this article, I am one week out from heading to New York City for my back surgery. What might I say in this newsletter article? I first want to offer my gratitude for so many of your prayers, which are already giving much strength and hope for the surgery and recovery ahead. What a great blessing your prayers are! Secondly, the outpouring of gifts to defray the expenses of our trip are also a true blessing. While I won't really know much of what is going on during a 10-hour surgery, it will be a difficult time for Amy, and having Alex along will be very helpful as she waits and takes taxis back and forth to the hotel. It can be an intimidating city to navigate through and with some of the anxiety of the surgery and recovery afterwards, it is a true comfort to have both Amy and Alex to be with me, and to support each other. Your generous gifts will greatly help to defray those travel, lodging and meal expenses during our time in New York. Please know that any remaining funds if there are any will be used for any follow-up trip I need to take to New York, one which I believe comes about 6-8 weeks after the surgery.

My main reason for going through this surgery beyond the pain relief and comfort level it should provide in the long term, is so that I will be in good health for many years to come as I continue to serve you as your pastor. As with any surgery there are risks of course, and this is not your typical surgery, but I have good confidence in the care I will be given and the skills the Lord has given to my surgeon, nurses and those who attend me. But I also share because it is equally true, that the Lord has each of us in His hands, and through the blood of our Savior Jesus, and His glorious resurrection, we know the ultimate outcome for all who believe, life eternal with Him. So I close with the words of Paul to the Philippians... "I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ. It is right for me to feel this way about you all, because I hold you in my heart, for you are all partakers with me of grace...." (Philippians 1:3–7, ESV) And...

"For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. Yet which I shall choose I cannot tell. I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better. But to remain in the flesh is more necessary on your account. Convinced of this, I know that I will remain and continue with you all, for your progress and joy in the faith, so that in me you may have ample cause to glory in Christ Jesus, because of my coming to you again."
