- The 4 castes are
 - 1. Teachers, scholars, and priests
 - 2. Warriors and rulers
 - 3. Merchants and other landowners
 - 4. Laborers (viewed way lower than the top 3)
- There is another group that doesn't even get classified called the "untouchables" that include occupations such as street sweepers, latrine cleaners, etc.
- The Indian government uses this system to this day

4. Reincarnation

- Reincarnation is the belief that we are reborn either in a higher or lower caste depending on how good you were in the previous life. This is Karma (the belief that you get what you deserve)
 - Contrast with Psalm 103:10 "He does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities."
 - Ecclesiastes 7:15 "There is a righteous man who perishes in his righteousness, and there is a wicked man who prolongs his life in his evildoing."
 - Ecclesiastes 8:14 "there are righteous people to whom it happens according to the deeds of the wicked, and there are wicked people to whom it happens according to the deeds of the righteous."

<u>Buddhism</u>
- Buddhism has around 500 million followers and is the dominant religion of many Asian countries.
About half live in Other countries with high Buddhist populations include
Cambodia, Thailand, Myanmar, Sri Lanka, Vietnam, Japan, and South Korea.
- Buddhism developed from the teachings of Siddhartha Gautama, "the Buddha", a teacher who lived in northern India between the 6th and 4th centuries BC. His teachings are called "dharma".
- The term Buddha means "". There is not only 1 Buddha. You can become a Buddha too if you become enlightened.
- The monks and nuns that follow Buddhism are called "Sangha".
- The leading monk in Tibetan Buddhism is called the "". He is

<u>Islam</u>
<u>Facts</u>
- Followers of Islam are called
- There are about 1.8 billion Muslims in the world, and are mostly concentrated in North Africa, the
Middle East, Western Asia, and Indonesia.

- Founded by around 600 AD in Arabia.
- Muhammad had visions where God told him the real truth about himself. He wrote down what God told him which became the ______, their sacred scripture.
- Muhammad is not just the instrument God used but is also the ideal Muslim. His life is one they try to emulate. The other text that some Muslims use is called the Hadith which is a collection of writings about Muhammad's day to day life.
- Islam is broken up into Sunni and Shia Muslims. They are about 85% Sunni (believe Muhammad's first convert and friend is successor) and 15% Shia (believe Muhammad's cousin is successor). Sunnis believe their leader should be chosen by the people where Shi'ites believe it must be a direct descendant of Muhammad.


<u>Beliefs</u>

- God: ______. Allah is the Muslim word for God, not God's name.
 - Islam is monotheistic > Allah is the only God
 - Do not believe in the trinity, he is a single-person god
 - Allah is transcendent, all-powerful, all-knowing, Creator, Judge
 - Allahu Akbar: "God is most great"
- Scripture: Quran (which means "the recitation"). They believe that the Bible is corrupted.
 - The Quran is believed to be eternal and only remains the Quran in its original language (Arabic). The actual book itself is holy.
- Rituals: Deeds (what you do) are more important than doctrine (what you believe). You are a Muslim if you do these things:
 - Five pillars of Islam:
 - 1. Confession "There is no god but Allah, and Muhammad is his messenger."
 - 2. Ritual prayer 5 times per day facing Mecca.
 - 3. Pilgrimage to Mecca.
 - 4. Fasting (Ramadan).
 - 5. Giving of alms.
- Jesus: Islam affirms that Jesus was born of a virgin, that he lived a sinless life, that he performed mighty miracles, and that he will come again at the end of history.
 - However, it explicitly denies that He is God, that He died on the cross, or that He was resurrected.
- Other beliefs:
 - Believe in many of the characters of the OT but believe Bible is corrupted
 - No original sin
 - Justification by works

The Trinity

What is the Trinity?

- 1. God is persons Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
- 2. Each person is God
- 3. There is God



To help us understand the trinity, the most important thing to remember is that

- ***God is first and foremost a Father***
- He is not primarily the ruler/creator (which makes him dependent on creation to be who he is)
- What characterizes a father? Giving life and loving
- He has been life-giving (begetting) to his Son and loving Him since eternity
- Since God has always loved the son, it is characteristic of God to create and love others

Why the trinity matters

- 1. A single-person god can't be a loving father
- If God is one person than love for another is not in his nature
- God could not be love with no one to love (same with other outgoing characteristics)
 - To be God means you don't depend on anything else to be who you are
 - If Allah is loving, he is dependent on his creation to be who he is and so is not God
- He could not be a father without a child
- Single alone-for-all-eternity god is fundamentally self-centered and self-gratifying
 - They do not like creation
- Single-person gods create merely to rule and be served > sin is to not perform (external)
 - Our God creates out of overflowing love > sin is to not love (matter of the heart)
- 2. Our salvation depends on the trinity
- God so loved the world that he gave his son (John 3:16)
 - a single-person God could not offer this salvation, couldn't love and has no son to give
- If Jesus is not fully God, he is a creature and could not bear the full wrath of God, only God can save
- 3. We could not be God's children if he were not a father
- If God were not a father, he could never give us the right to be his children, we would be distant hirelings
- 4. A single-person God would not have created or spoken
- If God were single why would he speak? Why should he start now? Why would he have created?
- A non-father is not capable of bringing forth life/creation
- Creation exists because God loves
 - His love comes first and it is his love that creates and gives life

- 5. The Trinity allows for acceptance of diversity
- The Trinity is a unity among diversity, different persons but 1 God
- This is why we can celebrate diversity i.e. the church, marriage, families
 - What happens to unity in the non-Christian worldview?
- Single-person god is alone for eternity, why would he value any besides him?
 - Under Allah cultures are made uniform = one way of praying, one way of marrying, buying, fighting, relating
 - In Eastern religions what is the goal? Nirvana, to become part of the oneness
- 6. The Trinity allows for acceptance of authority
- The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are equal in value but subordinate in role
- This is why we can celebrate submitting to authority i.e. marriage, work, church, families
 - Submitting to authority doesn't mean they are more valuable, Jesus shows this to be true because he submits to the Father but is still fully God
- Groups of people (egalitarians, evangelical feminists) that want to undermine the roles of women and men in churches and marriages have to attack the trinity to defend their position
- 7. Trinitarian God needs nothing > He is fully glorious on His own
- A single-person god needs worship and service to be glorious, he has needs and so is not God
- ***Belief in the trinity is central to Christianity.

Mormonism

<u>Facts</u>
- The official name of the church is "the Church of Jesus Christ of".
- There are over million Mormons. Most live in and most
American Mormons live in - Started by in the early 1800's. He had visions from an angel
- Started by in the early 1800's. He had visions from an angel
who told him that the truth is written on golden plates buried near his home and he needed to
translate them.
 - 2 Corinthians 11:14 "even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light."
- To test him, his neighbor pretended to lose the messages and asked for another
translation to see if it matched, but then there were new plates with new messages.
- The angel (conveniently) took the plates back when Joseph was done with them. These
translations became the in 1830.
- Joseph Smith "retranslated" the Bible - taking out all that didn't make sense to him (he did not
know Greek or Hebrew).
- As an aside, this is a hallmark of cult leaders > saying the church and scripture is
corrupted, the gospel has been lost and I am bringing the right message
- Mormonism had a number of issues with its leadership
 Multiple warrants for Joseph Smith's arrest (bank fraud)
 Polygamy (Joseph Smith had 25-50 wives) > caused trouble amongst leaders
- Believed the Garden of Eden was in Jackson County, MO and fought against the
Missouri State Militia.
- The next leader Brigham Young had 55 wives and moved the headquarters to Utah.
- Also went to war with the US.

- He lives with his wives from his planet who are now our "heavenly mothers"

Scripture > The Book of Mormon is the "most correct" book in the world.

cursed with "blackness" and became the primary ancestors of the American Indians.
- They believe the Bible is the word of God as far as it is translated correctly. Smith preached
the "restored gospel" and that the Bible had been corrupted.
- Brigham young claimed that every sermon he gave was scripture.
- New revelation from Mormon president can overrule any previous doctrine.

Jesus > Jesus is the first "spirit child", the product of sexual relations between God and one of the heavenly mothers. Satan was the second-born child to God and then the rest of humanity.

- Jesus is not God and is not eternal. There is no trinity.
- Jesus after rising from the dead went to ______ and preached the Mormon gospel to the people and started the Mormon church.

Us > The goal is for man to become a god and rule over his own world.

- We are all first spirit children which we have no memory of but God made a way for us to be gods by becoming humans so that we could do what god has already done.
 - So, is Mormonism monotheistic or polytheistic?
- Forgiveness of sins by works > exaltation happens by being a good Mormon
- They also believe that everyone is "saved" but your life determines which level of heaven you go to

Summary

Even though they call Jesus Savior, they say he atones for sins, they say they worship him, they deny scripture, deny the trinity, deny that Jesus is God, deny that we have a sinful nature, deny salvation by faith alone, and deny a final judgment.

- 97% of Mormons believe they are a Christian religion
- President Brigham Young said, "We, the Latter-day Saints, take the liberty of believing more than our Christian brethren: we not only believe ... the Bible, but ... the whole of the plan of salvation that Jesus has given to us. Do we differ from others who believe in the Lord Jesus Christ? No, only in believing more."
- Mormons try to say that they are Christianity plus a few other things (they try to downplay the differences) when in fact Mormonism is an attack on everything that Christianity believes.

- **Identifying problems** > The hard thing about cults is that they say a lot of things that seem right but we have to listen and read carefully to know what they actually mean. You can say the same things that Christians say but mean something completely different. We have to remember what sets Christianity apart (becoming so familiar with "the real" thing) so that we won't be led astray.

"But there are sincere people out there who believe the Latter-day Saints aren't Christians. In fact, the accusation that we are not Christians is probably the most commonly heard criticism of the LDS Church and its doctrines today. Why would anyone say such a thing? Isn't the name of our church The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints? Do we not worship Christ? Is not the Book of Mormon another testament of Jesus Christ? How could anyone seriously doubt that Latter-day Saints are Christians?

The Doctrinal Exclusion

This type of argument claims that since the Latter-day Saints do not always interpret the Bible as other Christians do, we must not be Christians. But, in fact, other denominations also differ among themselves doctrinally, and it is unreasonable to demand that Latter-day Saints conform to a single standard of "Christian" doctrine when no such single standard exists.

For example, the Latter-day Saints are accused of worshiping a "different god" because we do not believe in the traditional Trinity. "We believe in God, the Eternal Father, and in His Son, Jesus Christ, and in the Holy Ghost" (A of F 1:1) as taught in the New Testament. What Latter-day Saints do not believe is the non-Biblical doctrine formulated by the councils of Nicaea (A.D. 325) and Chalcedon (A.D. 451) centuries after the time of Jesus—the doctrine that God is three coequal persons in one substance or essence. We do not believe it because it is not scriptural. As Harper's Bible Dictionary states: 'The formal doctrine of the Trinity as it was defined by the great church councils of the fourth and fifth centuries is not to be found in the New Testament.'

Jesus didn't teach the Nicene doctrine of the Trinity. The New Testament writers didn't have any idea of it. The doctrine itself wasn't invented until centuries later. So one can't say the Latter-day Saints are not true Christians for not accepting it, unless one also excludes Jesus, his disciples, and the New Testament Church, who similarly did not know or teach it.

Finally, quite often we hear that Latter-day Saints are not Christians because true Christians believe in salvation by grace, while the Latter-day Saints believe in salvation through our own good works. But this is a misunderstanding. Yes, Latter-day Saints do believe we must serve God with all our "heart, might, mind, and strength" (D&C 4:2). But the Book of Mormon makes perfectly clear that it is impossible for us to completely earn or deserve our blessings from God (Mosiah 2:21, 24); that redemption can never come through individual effort alone, but only through the Atonement of Jesus Christ (2 Ne. 2:3, 5–8); and that—after all we can do (Alma 24:11)—we are saved by grace (2 Ne. 10:24; 2 Ne. 25:23)."

- "Orthodox" (Hassidic Jews would fall under this category) The most conservative branch. Practice the Torah meticulously.
- "Conservative" The moderate branch of Judaism. More liberal in beliefs but conservative in practice. Try to meld tradition and change together. Do not believe in a coming Messiah but that we can eventually achieve an age of peace.
- "Reformed" The most liberal branch. Don't believe the Bible is inspired. Don't believe in a coming Messiah as above. Don't believe in resurrection. This is the kind of Judaism you find in Hollywood.

Are Jews who do not believe that Jesus is the Messiah saved?
