After all, it is just another day of the year. September 1<sup>st</sup> is the 244<sup>th</sup> day of the year with 121 days remaining. It is the birthdays of late Ann Richards, Conway Twitty and Boxcar Willie, of television host Phil McGraw and comedian Lily Tomlin. It was the day that explorers found the wreckage of the Titanic and the day that the Korean Flight 007 was shot down by Soviet fighters. It holds no special recognition in this country but is the beginning of the liturgical year for the Eastern Orthodox Church. So for most of the world, the day goes by with little or no notice. But not here.

It is September 1<sup>st</sup>, the opening day of dove season. A time of fellowship with fellow hunters as you try to shoot a 12 inch long bird that weighs around 4.5 ounces while flying at 55 miles per hour. They say it is more about the fellowship than the hunt (I think that is an excuse for the failure to actually hit one. Do you ever see a dove fellowship meal?) Or maybe it is the day that your fishing license expires and you have to journey to the nearest store to have the privilege to drop a line in the water. But for me, especially this year, it marks the beginning of college football season. We have been anxiously awaiting this day for over 235 days. It is a time when friend turns on friend and families do not talk to one another. It is a time when your Friday attire might be of your alma mater or of your favorite team. It is a season that we begin to watch our local high school teams compete on the gridiron with hopes of a winning season. It reminds us that the fair is coming and we collect those treasures that we hope to gain.

In 1994, I was given a book written by Chuck Swindoll, it was titled, "Growing Strong in the Seasons of Life." For each season he linked a spiritual reality. For winter it can be a season of discouragement. For spring, the promise of new life and renewal. For summer, a lazy time to just be. And for autumn, a season of reflection. The bleakness of winter gave way to the green leaves of the spring. The green leaves of new birth reached to capture the rays of summer. Now, they prepare to fall back to creation. Seasons of life. Winter, spring, summer and fall.

Ecclesiates 3:1 "There is an appointed time for everything...."

We all go through spiritual seasons. We have times of discouragement when God seems far away. We have times of great spiritual growth and excitement. We have times of relaxation and contentment. But we also have seasons of reflection.

Hunters, fishermen and football players know, they have to have these seasons to prepare for the time.

Jesus understood that those who follow Him must turn daily to God and reflect on our season. Slowly pray the Lord's prayer and see what Jesus was asking us to accept. To trust in God for all things. To join in bringing the kingdom to earth. To forgive as He has forgiven us. To live in God's time and not ours.

In this season of reflection, how are you doing at letting go? How are you trusting and forgiving? How are you involved in bringing the justice (misphat) that God requires?
