

# Confession of Sin

James 2:1-13

The Call to Confession invites us to honest expression before God that we are not as we were made to be. The church is not a aatherina of perfect people. we are all sinners in various stages of recovery.

My brothers, show no partiality as you hold the faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory. For if a man wearing a gold ring and fine clothing comes into your assembly, and a poor man in shabby clothing also comes in, and if you pay attention to the one who wears the fine clothing and say, "You sit here in a good place," while you say to the poor man, "You stand over there," or, "Sit down at my feet," have you not then made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts? Listen, my beloved brothers, has not God chosen those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom, which he has promised to those who love him? But you have dishonored the poor man. Are not the rich the ones who oppress you, and the ones who drag you into court? Are they not the ones who blaspheme the honorable name by which you were called?

If you really fulfill the royal law according to the Scripture, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing well. But if you show partiality, you are committing sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors. For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it. For he who said, "Do not commit adultery," also said, "Do not murder." If you do not commit adultery but do murder, you have become a transgressor of the law. So speak and so act as those who are to be judged under the law of liberty. For judgment is without mercy to one who has shown no mercy. Mercy triumphs over judgment.

"Have mercy upon us, O God, according to your great compassion. Before you we stand guilty of the whole law. We have not loved you with all of our heart, soul, mind and strength. Rather, we have given the devotion of our hearts to all manner of idols. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. Instead, we have committed the sin of partiality and made judgments about our neighbors. We have exalted ourselves to be law givers, instead of humbling ourselves to be law keepers. Chasten, cleanse, and forgive us through our Lord Jesus Christ who always lives to make intercession for us. Grant us hearts from now on to love even as you love and to be holy even as you are holy. Hear us for we pray in the name of our Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, Amen."

The Declaration of Forgiveness breaks through the accusations of our conscience, the lies of the evil one, and proclaims the amazing truth of the gospel to our heart!

# † Sermon Text Reading

Ezekiel 7

The word of the LORD came to me: <sup>2</sup> "And you, O son of man, thus says the Lord God to the land of Israel: An end! The end has come upon the four corners of the land. <sup>3</sup> Now the end is upon you, and I will send my anger upon you; I will judge you according to your ways, and I will punish you for all your abominations. <sup>4</sup> And my eye will not spare you, nor will I have pity, but I will punish you for your ways, while your abominations are in your midst. Then you will know that I am the LORD.

<sup>5</sup> "Thus says the Lord God: Disaster after disaster! Behold, it comes. <sup>6</sup> An end has come; the end has come; it has awakened against you. Behold, it comes. <sup>7</sup> Your doom has come to you, O inhabitant of the land. The time has come; the day is near, a day of tumult, and not of joyful shouting on the mountains. <sup>8</sup> Now I will soon pour out my wrath upon you, and spend my anger against you, and judge you according to your ways, and I will punish you for all your abominations. <sup>9</sup> And my eye will not spare, nor will I have pity. I will punish you according to your ways, while your abominations are in your midst. Then you will know that I am the LORD, who strikes.

<sup>10</sup> "Behold, the day! Behold, it comes! Your doom has come; the rod has blossomed; pride has budded. <sup>11</sup> Violence has grown up into a rod of wickedness. None of them shall remain, nor their abundance, nor their wealth; neither shall there be preeminence among them. <sup>12</sup> The time has come; the day has arrived. Let not the buyer rejoice, nor the seller mourn, for wrath is upon all their multitude. <sup>13</sup> For the seller shall not return to what he has sold, while they live. For the vision concerns all their multitude; it shall not turn back; and because of his iniquity, none can maintain his life.

<sup>14</sup> "They have blown the trumpet and made everything ready, but none goes to battle, for my wrath is upon all their multitude. 15 The sword is without: pestilence and famine are within. He who is in the field dies by the sword, and him who is in the city famine and pestilence devour. <sup>16</sup> And if any survivors escape, they will be on the mountains, like doves of the valleys, all of them moaning, each one over his iniquity. <sup>17</sup> All hands are feeble, and all knees turn to water. <sup>18</sup> They put on sackcloth, and horror covers them. Shame is on all faces, and baldness on all their heads. <sup>19</sup> They cast their silver into the streets, and their gold is like an unclean thing. Their silver and gold are not able to deliver them in the day of the wrath of the LORD. They cannot satisfy their hunger or fill their stomachs with it. For it was the stumbling block of their iniquity. <sup>20</sup> His beautiful ornament they used for pride, and they made their abominable images and their detestable things of it. Therefore I make it an unclean thing to them. <sup>21</sup> And I will give it into the hands of foreigners for prey, and to the wicked of the earth for spoil, and they shall profane it. <sup>22</sup> I will turn my face from them, and they shall profane my treasured place. Robbers shall enter and profane it.

<sup>23</sup> "Forge a chain! For the land is full of bloody crimes and the city is full of violence. <sup>24</sup> I will bring the worst of the nations to take possession of their houses. I will put an end to the pride of the strong, and their holy places shall be profaned. <sup>25</sup> When anguish comes, they will seek peace, but there shall be none. <sup>26</sup> Disaster comes upon disaster; rumor follows rumor. They seek a vision from the prophet, while the law perishes from the priest and counsel from the elders. <sup>27</sup> The king mourns, the prince is wrapped in despair, and the hands of the people of the land are paralyzed by terror. According to their way I will do to them, and according to their judgments I will judge them, and they shall know that I am the LORD."

We celebrate communion each week to remember what Christ has done and to be nourished spiritually.

# Invitation to the Lord's Table

We warmly welcome to the table all who trust in Jesus Christ for their salvation, have been baptized, and are in good standing with any church that proclaims the Gospel. Please note that we use wine for Communion, but the inter rings (colored cups) contain non-alcoholic wine if you prefer. A gluten free wafer is available in place of bread. We come forward in two lines as each row is dismissed. We encourage children to come forward, but ask that they not take the elements unless they have met with their Elders to make a profession of their faith. There is no pressure to take communion if you are not ready. Feel free to stay in your seat or come forward but indicate that you are not partaking.

We recite a creed each week as a way to prepare for communion and also to connect our worship to generations of Christians who have gone before us.

# Affirmation of Faith The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit
and born of the virgin Mary.
