WE HEAR GOD'S WORD The Holy Scriptures

Hebrew Lesson

Proverbs 1:20-33 (NRSV) Lector: Rae Smith

Wisdom cries out in the street; in the squares she raises her voice. At the busiest corner she cries out; at the entrance of the city gates she speaks:

'How long, O simple ones, will you love being simple? How long will scoffers delight in their scoffing and fools hate knowledge?

Give heed to my reproof; I will pour out my thoughts to you; I will make my words known to you. Because I have called and you refused, have stretched out my hand and no one heeded, and because you have ignored all my counsel and would have none of my reproof, I also will laugh at your calamity; I will mock when panic strikes you, when panic strikes you like a storm, and your calamity comes like a whirlwind, when distress and anguish come upon you.

Then they will call upon me, but I will not answer; they will seek me diligently, but will not find me. Because they hated knowledge and did not choose the fear of the LORD, would have none of my counsel, and despised all my reproof, therefore they shall eat the fruit of their way and be sated with their own devices.

For waywardness kills the simple, and the complacency of fools destroys them; but those who listen to me will be secure and will live at ease, without dread of disaster.'

Mark 8:27-38 (NRSV) Rev. Katie Penick

Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi; and on the way he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say that I am?' And they answered him, 'John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets.' He asked them, 'But who do you say that I am?' Peter answered him, 'You are the Messiah.' And he sternly ordered them not to tell anyone about him.

Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him.

But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, 'Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.'

He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels.'

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

Sharing the Light: "*Taps,* "also know as "*Butterfield's Lullaby*" is a variation of an earlier bugle call known as "*Scott Tattoo.*" This variation that we know today as "*Taps*" was arranged by BG Daniel Butterfield while at Harrison's Landing with the Army of the Potomac. It was CPT John C. Tidball who started the custom of playing "*Taps*" at military funerals, and it became a standard component at military funerals in 1891. "*Taps*" is also sounded during each of the military wreath ceremonies conducted at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier every year, including the one on Memorial Day. It is also sounded nightly in military installations at non-deployed locations to indicate that it is "lights out" and often by Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, and Girl Guides to mark the end of an evening event such as a campfire.
