
### The Apostle Simon Peter

- Andrew's brother John 1:35-42
- Disciple of Christ, Leader of church

#### **Peter: A Complicated Character**

Most readers can relate to Peter because of his numerous successes and failures during his journey with Jesus

#### SUCCESSES

Chosen as one of Jesus' apostles Matt. 10:2

Walks to Jesus on the water Matt. 14:29

Confesses that Jesus is the Messiah, which is the foundation of the church Matt. 16:15–19

Witnesses the transfiguration Matt. 17:1–8

Vows never to fall away and to die with Jesus if necessary Matt. 26:33,35

Shares intimate moment with Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane Matt. 26:36–38

Follows Jesus after his arrest while the other disciples flee Matt. 26:58

#### **FAILURES**

Loses faith while walking on the water and almost drowns Matt. 14:30

Rebukes Jesus when he predicts his death Matt. 16:21-23


Initially refuses to let Jesus wash his feet John 13:8

Falls asleep in the Garden of Gethsemane Matt. 26:40-41

Tries to protect Jesus and cuts off Malchus's ear Luke 22:50-51; John 18:10

Denies Jesus three times
Matt. 26:69-75

Doesn't immediately believe when he sees the empty tomb Luke 24:11–12; John 20:6–7,9



## What's Your Impression of Peter?

- -Many, practically worship him
- Others are far too critical of him
- We all can associate with him! failures



Witnesses the risen Lord separately Luke 24:34; 1 Cor. 15:5

Reinstated by Jesus after his denial John 21:15–19

Gives the first sermon and 3,000 people believe Acts 2:14-41

Heals and raises the dead Acts 3:1-10; 5:12-16; 9:34,39-40

Proclaims Christ even after being imprisoned for preaching Acts 4:1-11,19-20

Assists Samaritans in receiving the Holy Spirit Acts 8:14-17

Preaches to Gentiles, and they receive the Holy Spirit Acts 10:27-28,34-35,44

Acknowledges that both Jews and Gentiles are saved by grace Acts 15:5-11

Writes two epistles: 1 and 2 Peter



### Begins with Conversion

- Simon, Cephas, Petros (Peter)

#### Personality and Character

- Impulsive, yet cowardly. (<u>Matthew</u> 14:28-30; 26:69, 70)
- ➤ Hot tempered (<u>John 18:10</u>), yet tenderhearted. (<u>Matthew 26:75</u>)
- ➤ Insightful (<u>Matthew 16:16</u>), yet ignorant. (<u>Matthew 16:21-23</u>)
- Courageous and solid after Pentecost (Acts 5:28-30), yet was hypocritical. (Galatians 2:11-13)


### "Follow Me"

- His will be done on earth as in Heaven!





# PETER: The Three Stages of His Life

In the Gospel of Mark we have Peter WALKING WITH JESUS.

In the Book of Acts 1-12 we have Peter WORKING FOR JESUS. In Acts we find Peter WORKING for Jesus. Peter opened the doorway to Christ for the world:

- Jews Acts 2
- Samaritans Acts 8
- Gentiles Acts 10


And in 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Peter we have Peter WAITING FOR JESUS to the end of his life.





"This cup, which is poured out for you, is the new covenant in My blood."

### Are you a son of Jonah?

- -Matthew 16:4 the evil want signs Jonah
- -Matthew 16:17 "Blessed are you, Simon Barjona"
- Barjona = son of Jonah? Or John?



No one **ever was honored** like Peter. "Thou art Peter – and upon this rock..." (Matthew 16.18)

No one was ever rebuked as sharply as when Jesus called Peter a tool of Satan. "Get thee behind me Satan..." (Matthew 16.23)

No one **ever claimed greater loyalty** to Christ as did Peter "though all others may – I NEVER will!" (Mark 14.31)

No one **ever denied Jesus** like Peter. Not once, not twice – but three times. "I know not the man" (Matthew 26.74)



The Gospel by Mark is the premier book of God's Word about hope - hope for a new start, hope for complete forgiveness, hope in the God of the 2<sup>nd</sup>chance. And no one knew that better than Peter.

There was a man called Peter, who knew Jesus better than any other human on earth ever did. Next to Christ no one in the New Testament is mentioned by name more than Peter!



# Simon was his name.

So, it was a strange meet-and-greet to be told by Jesus that his new name would be Peter (I'm sorry, what?), especially considering the name Peter means "rock."

Simon Peter was too emotional and impulsive to be worthy of such a name. When Jesus tried to wash his feet, Peter refused to allow his Master to stoop. But then Jesus said, "If I don't wash you, you have no share with me," and suddenly Peter wanted a full body bath. When soldiers came to arrest Jesus, Peter drew his sword and cut off a guy's ear (not sure what the plan was there). But then after Jesus' arrest, all of Peter's ear-cuting bravado vanished. To avoid being arrested himself, he denied even knowing Jesus—not once, but three times. So, his instability begs the question:

## Why did Jesus call an unstable person "rock"?

Pre-Jesus Simon was a rash, brash fisherman who's mouth and choices got him into trouble. Post-Jesus Simon did indeed become Peter: bedrock preacher of the early church, healer of the sick and lame, author of two New Testament books, and fearless unto death.

Because Jesus makes us what we're not.

# The CHOSEN

#### Who are the Twelve Disciples?

#### Their Backgrounds


- The twelve disciples were from the Galilee region except for Judas Iscariot, who was from Judea.
- Their occupations ranged from fisherman to tax collectors and revolutionaries.
- Some were married. (see Mark 1:29-31; 1 Corinthians 9:3-6)
- Some were well-versed in Scripture. (see John 1:46)

#### Their Purpose

- After being baptized by John the Baptist and spending 40 days in the wilderness, Jesus started teaching and many people started following him.
- After a night of prayer and meditation, Jesus chose twelve men out of all those who were following him.
- These twelve men would be Jesus' main focus of instruction.
- These disciples were selected to let the world know of God's love, that God sent Jesus to redeem the world. (see John 17:23)

#### Their Mission

- These are the twelve men who, for the most part, would prove to be valuable companions to Jesus.
- Their instruction and conversations would become the teachings, knowledge, and instruction for the church that would later grow and spread.
- Jesus knew their personalities, both strong and weak.
- Jesus knew that these men would disappoint him, desert him, deny him, and betray him.
- Jesus knew that these men, once filled with the Holy Spirit, would be the first witnesses of the Gospel, carrying God's message of redemption to Judea, Samaria, and the ends of the earth.
- The twelve tribes of Israel were blessed in order to be a
  blessing to all nations. In a similar way, these twelve men,
  along with all disciples of Jesus who follow their lead,
  were to bless all nations. (see Galatians 3:8) Followers of
  Christ are commanded to go out and make disciples of all
  nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, The Son,
  and the Holy Spirit.

### Encounters with Jesus

- Was called to be a fisher of men. (Matthew 4:19) Left everything to follow Jesus. (Luke 5:11)
- One of the three disciples in the core group of disciples. (Mark 5:37; 9:2; 13:3; 14:33)
- Simon said Jesus is the Christ, Son of the living God. Jesus names him Peter (rock) and said, "Upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hell will not prevail against it." (Matthew 16:16-19)
- Was reprimanded because he refused to accept that Jesus had to die. (Matthew 16:23)
- Witnessed Jesus' Transfiguration (where Jesus' divinity was revealed). (Mark 9:2-8)
- Was sent to prepare the upper room for the Last Supper. (Luke 22:8)
  Jesus predicted that Peter would deny knowing him three times. (Luke 22:31-34)
- Was with Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. (Matthew 26:36-46)
- Jesus instructed Peter after his resurrection. (John 21:15-19)

#### **Key Lesson**

God can forgive sins and strengthen the faith of those who love him.




Papias (second-century Christian) recorded that Mark served as Peter's scribe and wrote the Gospel of Mark based on Peter's testimony.

Symbols for Peter are sometimes keys, representing the keys to the kingdom of heaven. (Matthew 16:19)







#### SYMBOLS OF THE 12 APOSTLES



ST. PETER

The keys refer to the keys of Heaven, and the inverted cross refers to Peter's crucifixion.



ST. ANDREW

According to tradition, St. Andrew was crudified on an X-shaped cross.



ST. THOMAS

The ruler refers to the tradition that St. Thomas built a church by hand. The spear refers to his martyrdom.



ST. SIMON

52. Simon, companions with 51. Jude, was a fisherman by trade, but also known as a great fisher of men.



ST. JOHN "THE BELOVED"

This symbol reflects to the legend of a poisoned chalice offered to St. John in an attempt to end his life.



ST. JAMES THE LESSER

According to tradition. St. James was stoned and sawn by his attackers.



ST. JUDE

St. Jude (also known as Thacideus) selled to many ports as he journeyed as a missionery.



ST. PHILIP

Jesus directed St. Philip to feed His people, represented here by two circles of bread.



#### ST. JAMES THE GREATER

 James was the first to go on a missionary journey. The scallop shells represent pilgrimage.



ST. MATTHEW

The moneybags refer to the occupation of St. Matthew before he was called by Christ.
