# CHURCH STAFF

## Myers-Briggs Personality Types

If you're at a transition point in your ministry or perhaps just getting started looking for a church position, it can be helpful to take a look at your personality type and natural "wiring." The Myers-Briggs Type Indicator (MBTI) has long been a useful personality assessment for both church staff and the business world alike. Based on what MBTI says are strengths of each personality type, here are some ideas of what church staff roles could be a good fit with those strengths.

**IMPORTANT:** This is not to say that, for example, only ENFJs should be Lead Pastors. On the contrary, we've interacted with Senior Pastors of every personality type, and the same goes for every position listed. This is simply a fun guide to show some patterns we see and how some of the types' strengths could complement a ministry role well.

## FIVE NAMED JAMES

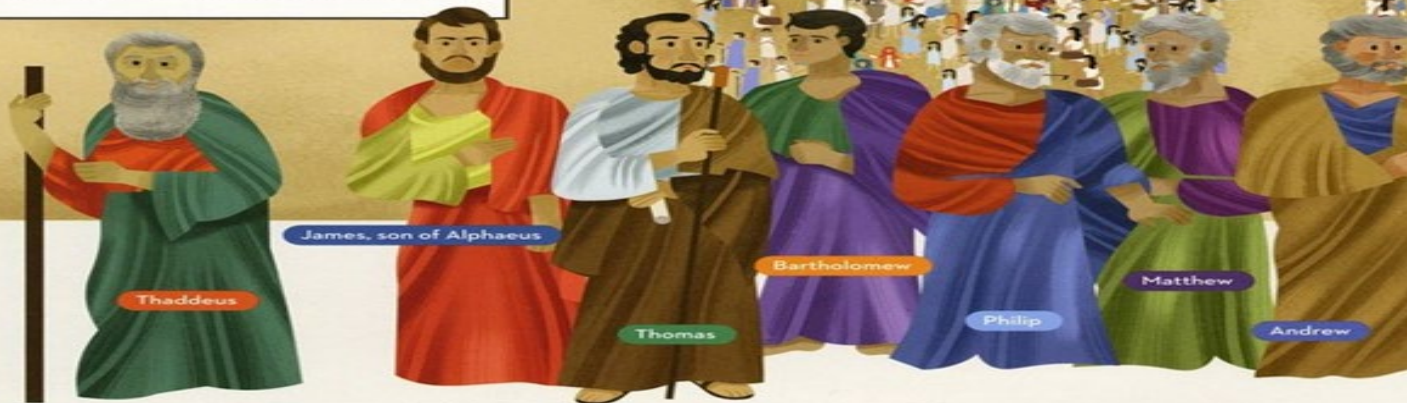
Four (or, perhaps, five) people with the name of James appear in the pages of the New Testament.

IDENTIFICATION	SCRIPTURE	DESCRIPTION
1. James, father of Judas (not Iscariot)	Luke 6:16	Nothing is known about this James. He is mentioned in the list of the original twelve disciples as the father of Judas (not Iscariot) to distinguish him from Judas the betrayer. This Judas is also distinguished by the name "Thaddaeus."
2. James, Son of Zebedee, brother of John	Matthew 4:21; 10:2; 17:1; Mark 1:19, 29; 3:17; 5:37; 9:2; 10:35, 41; 13:3; 14:33; Luke 5:10; 6:14; 8:51; 9:28, 54; Acts 1:13; 12:2	Brother of the apostle John and one of the "Sons of Thunder." He witnessed some of Jesus' private miracles, was present at Christ's transfiguration, and was invited to pray with Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane. This James was the first of the twelve disciples to be martyred. He was put to death with a sword around AD 44.
3a. James, son of Alphaeus	Matthew 10:3; Mark 3:18; Luke 6:15; Acts 1:13	One of the twelve disciples, distinguished as the "son of Alphaeus" to keep him distinct from James #2. Many scholars believe #3a and #3b, "James the Less," are the same person.
3b. James the Less, son of Mary	Matthew 27:56; Mark 15:40; 16:1; Luke 24:10	The son of one of the women named Mary who witnessed Jesus' burial and resurrection. Many believe "James the Less" is the same as James, the son of Alphaeus (#3a), though he could be a different person altogether.
4. James, son of Joseph and Mary, half brother of Jesus	Matthew 13:55; Mark 6:3; Acts 1:14; 12:17; 15:13; 21:18; Galatians 1:19; 2:9, 12; 1 Corinthians 15:7; Jude 1:1	The natural son of Mary and Joseph after the birth of Jesus. Though he did not believe in his brother Jesus during His earthly ministry (John 7:5), after the risen Lord made a special appearance to him, James became a believer and eventually the leader of the Jewish Christian church in Jerusalem until he was martyred around AD 62.



# THE FIRST CHRISTIANS

The very first followers of Jesus were the same people who knew him when he traveled and healed and taught in Palestine. They were the ones who witnessed his crucifixion. After the risen Jesus appeared to some of these friends and followers, they began to worship together at the great temple in Jerusalem. They were the first believers—and the church grew from that core group.



## The Seventy

Along with the smaller group of twelve, a larger bunch of disciples had surrounded, served, and learned from Jesus while he was living. This included seventy people whom Jesus sent out into the cities and towns around Galilee to announce the arrival of God's kingdom. It's likely that many of these people were also part of the community that gathered in Jerusalem to see what would happen next. Some became deacons in the early church, charged with caring for the community's poor and vulnerable.

## LATE TO THE PARTY

A Jewish Pharisee named Saul, from the city of Tarsus, was an early enemy of the Jesus followers. After experiencing a vision of the resurrected Jesus, Saul changed his life and became an apostle. Sometime later, he became known as Paul. His work helped spread the news about Jesus throughout the world.

James the Less?

Yes and no . . .

## YES

The church has traditionally nicknamed him "James the Less" to avoid confusion with the son of Zebedee, "James the Great."

## NO

The man Mark calls "James the Less" is not likely one of the apostles. "Less" in this sense means "little," "short," or even "junior." (Mk 15:40)

### Matthew's brother?

Levi (Matthew) is also called the son of Alphaeus (Mk 2:14). However, the evangelists call attention to other sets of brothers within the twelve (Mt 10:3; Mk 3:17; Lk 6:14), but not Matthew and James.

### Jude's father?

Jude/Judas/Thaddaeus is the son of a man named James, but James was such a common name at the time that we can't be sure which James is Judas' father.

For example, when Luke tells us Jude is the son of James, there are no less than three men named James in the same room: this James, the son of Zebedee, and the brother of Jesus (Ac 1:13-14).



Seriously, we don't know much about James aside from who his father was (Alphaeus). That's all we got, folks.

# A few quick facts on the apostle James, son of Alphaeus



## One of the Twelve

James son of Alphaeus was one of Jesus' 12 closest followers. He spent three years with Jesus, witnessing his miracles and teachings.



## Possibly James the Less

When mentioned in the Gospels, all four gospels, two of these with unknown named Mary the one who was "the mother of James," and Mark 15:40 (written thus as "James son of Alphaeus," James believes this is the same person as James son of Alphaeus.



## Possibly the brother of Jesus

James, brother of Jesus, also known as James the son, was the leader of the Church in Jerusalem and is the brother of the Lord of Jesus. Tradition claims this is the same person as James son of Alphaeus. Modern scholars are unsure.



## Matthew's brother?

James isn't the only brother who is mentioned in "son of Alphaeus," Mark 2:14 (written thus as "James son of Alphaeus," Mark 15:40 (written thus as "James son of Alphaeus," two Mark scholars don't think they're related, though.



## A missionary?

All of the apostles were sent to be missionaries in some form, but since the mission was to the Jews and the Gentiles, it's likely that James son of Alphaeus, James the Less, and James, brother of Jesus, were all the same people, when James son of Alphaeus was in a little fuzzy. It may have been Jerusalem, or Egypt, but we don't really know.

**Weaknesses:** Slow, moody, brooding, easily discouraged, prone to depression or despondency, irresolute, confused by noise and crowds, fearful, reserved, finds it difficult to make friends, tends to passivity, resentment, holds grudges, lacks confidence, indecisive, second-guesses decisions, critical and suspicious of others, makes mountains out of molehills, requiring cheering up, aloof, tends to find problems everywhere

**Famous melancholic:** Abraham Lincoln, "Pistol" Pete Marovich, Albert Brooks (Nemo's dad), St. Paul

**Relationship needs:** sensitivity, support, "space"

**Weaknesses:** Slow, indecisive, indifferent, lack of ambition, tends to laziness, passive, will agree just to avoid confrontation, avoids leadership, avoids pressure, make lack self-worth if they are neglected because they are so demanding, indifferent, will resort to "I don't care" or "it doesn't matter"

**Famous phlegmatic:** Tim Duncan, Sandy Koufax, Keanu Reeves, St. Thomas Aquinas

**Relationship needs:** peace and harmony, respect and appreciation, motivation
