Then Jesus said, "Whoever welcomes one of these children in my name welcomes me." Mark 9:37a

Sometimes the lectionary text for a given week is uncannily appropriate. This Sunday, we get to hear Jesus say these words to his disciples, on the same day we will be welcoming all generations to worship at 10am in the sanctuary. How perfect is that? To welcome children is to welcome Jesus himself. To make our service more welcoming to children, we have removed our two front pews to create designated children's worship areas. Erin has created worship toolkits that will give young people concrete ways to participate in the service. Our bulletins will also have graphics indicating what tool a child can utilize with a given portion of the service. Indoor policy due to Franklin County COVID-19


