Hearing God's Word:

Today in church we learned that we can choose to live for God and not let arguments or wrong motives get in the way. We also blessed our prayer blankets filled with prayers, blessings, and hope to comfort those in need. Some of the scriptures we explored today included Psalm 1; James 3:13-4:3, 7-8a; and Mark 9:30-37.

True Wisdom

Is there anyone among you who is truly wise and understanding? Then he should show his wisdom by living right. He should do good things without being proud. A wise person does not brag. But if you are selfish and have bitter jealousy in your



hearts, you have no reason to brag. Your bragging is a lie that hides the truth. That kind of "wisdom" does not come from God. That "wisdom" comes from the world. It is not spiritual. It is from the devil. Where there is jealousy and selfishness, there will be confusion and every kind of evil. But the wisdom that comes from God is like this: First, it is pure. Then it is also peaceful, gentle, and easy to please. This wisdom is always ready to help those who are troubled and to do good for others. This wisdom is always fair and honest. When people work for peace in a peaceful way, they receive the good result of their right living. Do you know where your fights and arguments come from? They come from the selfish desires that make war inside you. You want things, but you do not have them. So you are ready to kill and are jealous of other people. But you still cannot get what you want. So you argue and fight. You do not get what you want because you do not ask God. Or when you ask, you do not receive because the reason you ask is wrong. You want things only so that you can use them for your own pleasures. So give yourselves to God. Stand against the devil, and the devil will run away from you. Come near to God, and God will come near to you. You are sinners. So clean sin out of your lives. You are trying to follow God and the world at the same time. Make your thinking pure.

Family Reflection: Delight in God's Word



Who here likes to read? I love to read. Books are often filled with amazing stories that take us to far-off places. [Have each family member share their favorite book. If someone doesn't have a favorite book, that's perfectly okay. Just say "pass."]

Books are great because they can teach us things and tell exciting stories. Who is your favorite character in a book?


[Take turns answering and commenting on some of the characters.]

I love to read, and one of my favorite books actually changed my life.

Now this book, the Bible, is God's Word and is life-changing. Everyone say, "God's Word." The Bible is the greatest book of all time. It contains God's words to us, and they're helpful to lead, comfort, instruct, and encourage us. The Bible provides us with God's direction, comfort, hope, and more. It is a roadmap for us from God.

The Bible is made up of 66 books. There are 39 books in the Old Testament and 27 books in the New Testament. Despite there being so many books in the Bible, God's Word tells one great story. The story of the Bible is all about the one true God who created everything and loves us so much that He sent His Son Jesus to save us. That's why the Bible is the most amazing book. No matter how many times you read it, God can always teach you something new.

Psalm 1 tells us to delight in God's Word, so remember just as we get excited about the next book in our favorite series, we can learn to get excited about God's Word and enjoy hearing what God has to say to us.

Family Discussion:

A theme of this week in some way is "words". In Psalm 1, we are instructed to delight in God's Word, and in our epistle reading in James, we are given guidance about how to use our own words. Our words can cause others to feel loved or unloved, accepted or not. Words can change our emotions within our hearts and minds too.

> <u>A Question for Adults to ask Children</u>: How does your body feel when you are angry?

Talk about the difference between feeling an emotion and acting on it. There are things in the world that will make us angry because they are wrong – it is how we respond that matters.

<u>A Question for Children to ask Adults</u>: What do you do to help yourself calm down when you are angry?

A great opportunity to talk about stress management tools available to us like a meditative walk, stress-relief balls, a personal "timeout" and so forth.

Dear God,

Thank You for Your Word, the Bible. We are grateful that You love us so much that You sent Your Son, Jesus, and that You tell us all about it in the Bible. Help us make time for Your Word and take delight in it.

We also pray that You help us to only use loving words when we speak so that our neighbors know Your love through our words and actions.


could go on a walk in nature and try to find some seeds to plant or try using some seeds from fruits or vegetables you eat during



the week.


Connect with God Together: Complete this activity to let out your anger and give any problems or events that caused it to God.



Purify your hearts.




