Hope

1 Corinthians 13:13 says, "faith, hope, and love abide." Do you still have hope? In Scripture "hope" has to do with the expectation that something—good things—will happen. It seems like we live in dread—the expectation that bad things will happen. Are you dreading the future? There is hope.

Hope persists because we have faith. Faith is "the substance of things hoped for and the evidence of things not seen" (Heb 11:6). Faith refers to the Christians' knowledge of God and conviction to entrust their lives to him. With faith there is always trust. Faith stokes the fires of hope. Since we have faith, we don't give up on hope.

With hope and faith, we have love. With hope and faith, our love grows. We love our God and we love his care. Hope could be defined as "The confidence that, by integrating God's redemptive acts in the past with trusting human responses in the present, the faithful will experience the fullness of God's goodness both in the present and in the future" (LBD). This definition of faith helps us to remember why we love our God. He has acted. He has brought salvation to us. The saved look forward to even more gracious gifts from God. How could we not love him.

One Hebrew word translated "hope" is the verb) קוָה gawah) which means "to wait or to look for with eager expectation." Don't give up. Keep waiting on the Lord.
