Why Be Baptized?

Most everyone familiar with Christian teaching understands that baptism is an important Christian practice. "Baptism is the initiatory sign by which we are admitted to the fellowship of the Church, that being ingrafted into Christ we may be accounted children of God" (*ICR* IV xv, 1). But why? Why should someone be baptized?

Be baptized because God brings new creation out of water. In Genesis 1 Moses recorded how the dry land appeared after the waters receded. After the children of Israel were led out of Egypt, they crossed the Red Sea and their problems were washed away in their wake. When the Israelites were ready to enter the Promised Land, they crossed the Jordan with Joshua and the ark of presence. When Jesus told Nicodemus that he had to be born again of water and Spirit (Jn 3:1-5), it seems that he was alluding to this Old Testament theme.

Be baptized because Jesus commanded baptism. In Matthew 28:19-20, Jesus commanded that those who would be his disciples must be baptized. Baptism is necessary because it is a command of God. Be baptized to be a disciple.

Be baptized because of God's promises. When Peter preached Jesus, he also commanded baptism. When Peter first preached baptism, he attached two promises to the act. He said, "repent and be baptized so that your sins are forgiven and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit" (Acts 2:38). Be baptized to receive God's blessings

Be baptized to be "in Christ." For Paul, to be a Christian is to be "in Christ." In Galatians 3:26-27 and Romans 6:3, the Spirit moved Paul to write that we are "baptized into Christ." All spiritual blessings are available "in Christ." Be baptized to be in Christ.

Be baptized to be in the church. Just as Paul said that we are baptized into Christ, we are also said to be baptized into the church. 1 Corinthians 12:13 says, "we are all baptized by one Spirit into one body."

Be baptized as an appeal for a clean conscience. Our consciences keep us up at night because we can't forgive ourselves for all we have done. Peter said, "Corresponding to that, baptism now saves you—not the removal of dirt from the flesh, but an appeal to God for a good conscience—through the resurrection of Jesus Christ" (1 Pet 3:21). Wouldn't it be great to live with a clear conscience?


The Lomax Congregation has received a donation to the Food for Friends Program.

Did you know September 27th is the National Day of Forgiveness? I had no idea there was a National Day of Forgiveness. Forgiveness is described as a potent tool of spiritual, mental, emotional, and physical health. That is powerful. The bible speaks of forgiving each other. Luke 17:3-4 "Pay attention to yourselves! If your brother sins, rebuke him, and if he repents, forgive him, and if he sins against you seven times in the day, and turns to you seven times, saying, 'I repent,' you must forgive him." You may wonder about the 7 times in a day. It is an expression we might think of hyperbole. Actually it is meant to show the seriousness of giving forgiveness no matter how often we are asked. It is our demeanor as a Christian and certainly not a one time a year remembrance. Eph. 4:32 "Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you." Matt. 6:15 "But if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." These verses add additional depth to our understanding. Forgiveness to others is a reflection of how we hope God will be toward us. So remember the national day of forgiveness September 27th, but be sure to practice it every day as a Christian.
