Title: The Character of the Christian: Older Teaching the Younger III

Introduction

- I. Older Women teaching the Younger Women
 - A. What objections are raised and what is to be said to them?
 - B. The older cannot simply be *used* in churches to be the scaffolding.
 - C. The older saints, both men and women, as we have learned from the Apostle, must have stable, demonstrable godliness founded in truth that they may be able, by word and example, to instruct, exhort, admonish younger saints.
 - D. This also means that the older saints cannot simply move to retirement - meaning non-participation.
 - E. This means that younger saints men and women must cultivate humility to hear, to learn, to observe.
 - F. This means we must realize that this inter-generational ministry is important and necessary.
