Mummers' Parade Seats Available




Did you know?

(5 facts as listed by US News & World Report)

- **1** The average life expectancy of a homeless person is just **50 years**.
- **2 39.8%** of homeless persons are African Americans.
- **61%** of homeless persons are men and boys.
- 4 **20%** of homeless persons are kids.
- 5 42% of street children identify as LGBT.

Here's a promising statistic on homelessness That we want to ensure is made possible to more homeless persons. It states that permanent housing intervention has grown by 450%

The most actionable bill to address housing access and homelessness is the **American Jobs Plan**. It proposes **\$213 billion** for housing programs, including **\$40 billion** to improve



public housing. These investments emphasize affordable housing assistance. We'd like to see more focused on homelessness prevention programs, and there is legislation currently in negotiation.

In 2021, Neighbors in Need "Unfailing Love" offering is focused on supporting organizations and projects that are serving homeless and immigrant neighbors or communities. 40 Days * 38 Congregations * 1 Church United in Prayer

Even Paul knew that the mystery of Christ, the Kingdom of God, was irrevocably tied to prayer.

The Catoctin Association is 38 churches - a wide diversity of geography, faith, and practice, and yet one body. In essence the association could be represented by a patch quilt, each congregation an individual patch –different, unique and beautiful in its own way. But God uses the gift of prayer, weaving us all together as one united association supporting and complimenting one another in even mightier ways than imagined before. Separate and together, we labor side by side for a more just and generous world. That work is rooted in prayer - the prayers of our people, congregations, and the wider church. Those roots of prayer through the grace of God, roots love in the same instance so that we all may be one, rooted in prayer and love together.

On Oct. 6th, we will launch 40 Days of Prayer, where we will pray for each congregation, by name. We want to kneel in prayer as one association in prayer for each other through 40 days, to practice our covenant commitments to each other to love and support one another as siblings in Christ, to strengthen and encourage each other as a new chapter of faith emerges in our region.

Does your congregation need help writing your prayer or creating a video? Also reach out to Sam so we can have an association member work with you.

We're really excited about the power of 38 congregations praying together, as one body, for 40 days. We can't think of anything more UCC than living into our covenant with prayer and presence.


