The Morning Star of the Reformation

October 31, 1517 is the traditional date for the start of the Protestant Reformation. That is the day Martin Luther nailed his *Ninety-Five Theses* to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg.

However, almost two centuries earlier, John Wycliffe was born in Yorkshire, England in about 1329. Wycliffe attended Oxford University. He excelled in his studies, particularly in philosophy and was appointed to serve on the faculty at Oxford University. But the study of the Bible pulled hard at him. As he studied theology and Scripture, he realized how far the Church had drifted into error.

In his writings, Wycliffe questioned papal authority, criticized the sale of indulgences (which were supposed to release a person from punishment in purgatory), denied the reality of transubstantiation (the teaching that the bread and wine in communion became the actual body and blood of Jesus), and spoke out against church hierarchies. The pope attempted to have Wycliffe dismissed from his teaching post at Oxford University but his colleagues would not allow it.

Wycliffe's greatest contribution, however, was the translation of the Bible into the common language of the people. He believed that the way to prevail against the abuses of authority in the church was for the people to be able to read the Bible in their own language. Once they could read the Bible for themselves, they would learn how to have a personal relationship with God through Jesus Christ—apart from any ecclesiastical intervention. So, Wycliffe and his associates translated the Bible into English from the Latin text. This was truly revolutionary.

After Wycliffe finished translating the Bible into English, he organized a group of parishioners, known as the Lollards, to go throughout England to read the Scriptures in the mother tongue of the people and explain the Bible to the people. Consequently, the Word of God became available to all English-speaking people.

It is primarily for his work of translating the Bible into the mother tongue of the people that Wycliffe is known as “The Morning Star of the Reformation.” The morning star is actually the planet Venus, which appears before the sun rises while darkness still dominates the horizon. Wycliffe’s work enabled the later reformers to see what God can do when people have the Word of God and the truth of God in their own language.

Let us thank God for people like Wycliffe and may there continue to be reformation in our day.

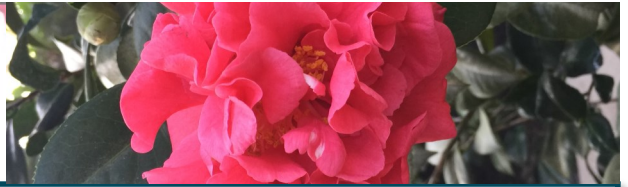

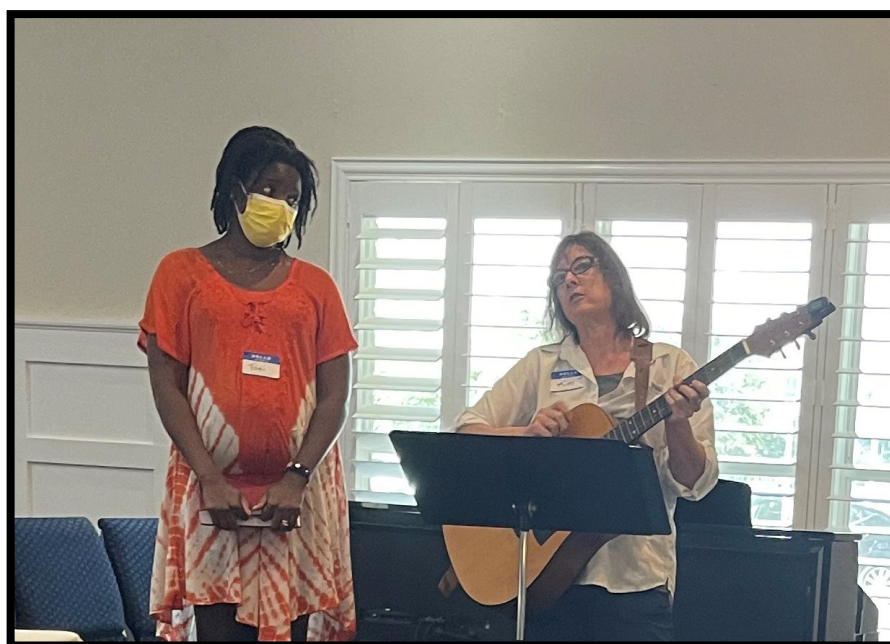

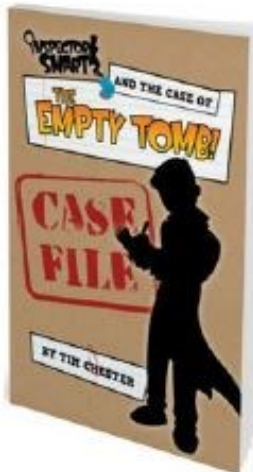

English as a Second Language (ESL) Update Karen Cross, Coordinator

The ESL school year began August 25. We have forty students enrolled, and are offering six different classes per week. Three of our classes will take place in person at the church on Thursday mornings. The other three classes will remain on Zoom.

We really need 3-5 new volunteers to work with us this year. Our main need is to have a volunteer that will help Alan on Thursday evenings from 6:30 p.m.—8:00 p.m. This class will remain on Zoom for the entire year and is for students that work during the day.

All students and volunteers use the same books. All of the lessons in the books are printed in the books in great detail; the answers to any practice questions are included in the back of the books. Volunteers help the students work through the workbooks. There is no need to prepare extra lesson plans, everything is provided for you.

ESL is such a wonderful mission, our students are growing in English Skills, and they are so eager and happy to learn!

We also have a Scripture, Devotion, Vocabulary, Praise Song, and Prayer time the last twenty minutes of each class. Each class uses the same lesson, and everything is provided to all volunteers and students a week in advance. The volunteers and students are all reviewing the same material and take turns practicing their reading, reading comprehension, and listening skills. This is such a wonderful opportunity to share the Gospel with those within our community!

We have a great core group of lead volunteers and are really in need of assistants and substitutes. Please pray about it, and let us know if you would like to join us. We would love to continue to grow and accept more students, but we cannot do so without more volunteers.

Third Quarter 2021 Men's Breakfast

On September 18, 2021, Men's Ministry had its first Men's Breakfast since December of 2019. This was Scott's first breakfast at the church with the men and he and the other 17 men were equally pleased with the outcome.



We began the breakfast at approximately 8:30 a.m. The breakfast was prepared by Alisa and Brian Carrier, who enjoy cooking for the men of TBPC. Some of the items served were thick-cut bacon, sausage links, homemade biscuits and gravy, scrambled eggs, French toast, and a fruit tray along with coffee and orange juice. It was an enjoyable morning as all of the men enjoyed the breakfast immensely.



Following breakfast, the Men's Ministry Director, Brian Carrier, spoke about the events that we would be doing the remainder of the year, including the annual fishing trip and the Christmas breakfast in December. We are also looking at the Carrollwood Players this year as a possible third venue for everyone to enjoy.

Brian then introduced Jeff Beams, the Men's Bible Study leader, and Jeff discussed the Bible Study Group. The study group began again on September 11. It meets at 7:45 a.m. on Saturday mornings. We are studying the book of Acts and we are using another Bible study guide by Dr. Jack B. Scott. He invited those who are interested to please attend if they are thinking of attending.

Brian Carrier also introduced our very own Pastor Freddy Fritz who is offering a Men's Discipleship Group that began on September 25 at 7:45 a.m. Freddy is using a book titled, *Disciplines of a Godly Man* by R. Kent Hughes. The class will help men grow in their discipleship in the areas of relationships, prayer, worship, character, service, leadership, and more. Freddy was encouraging any of the men who would like to attend to please be at the church by 7:45 a.m.



Brian then introduced our own Rev. Scott Simmons who provided a word to the men at the breakfast. The title of Scott's presentation was, "The Utopian Societies that Began in the State of Florida." Scott explained that there were a number of Utopian Societies in Florida that began, and many of them were planted and failed, in the state. Some of them had a short lifespan and others were longer. Many of the names in certain areas of the state retained the name of these Utopian Societies. Eventually they all failed because they were missing one item, which was God, at the forefront of these societies. Scott explained that even though they were strong in the beginning, they never had God in these societies. God must be involved in our daily lives otherwise, there is a sure chance of failure. It may not happen right away, but eventually failure is inevitable.

We need God in our daily lives by reading the Word and getting involved in some additional worship with others at the church. Good examples are the Men's Bible Study or the Men's Discipleship Group. These are great study groups where we can go through the Bible and strengthen our relationship with our father God in heaven. This is accomplished by reading the word daily, living a godly life daily as Jesus did on earth, and spread the word of the good news to other Christians and to non-Christians.



The breakfast ended with Scott providing prayer after his message. It was truly a blessing to hear the word from a true man of God, our own Rev. Scott Simmons.

The Men's Ministry would like to thank all the men who participated in the breakfast event and made this a very successful and popular event. The Men's Ministry continues to offer these events to bring Christian men together for a time of fun and fellowship.

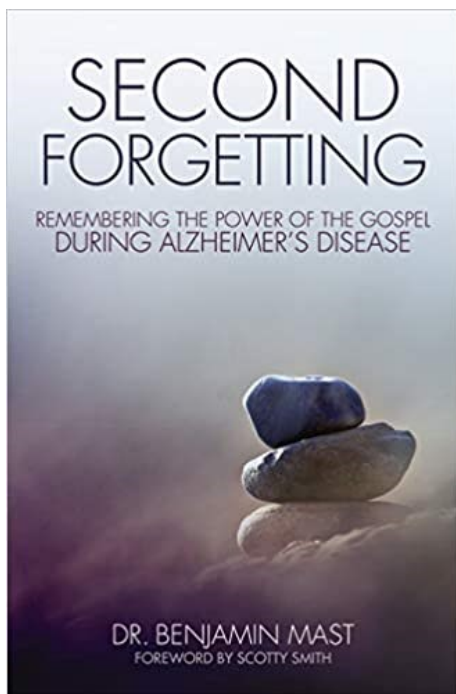

The website is complete, but we are looking for someone to help maintain it. This would involve weekly/monthly document uploads and new or updated pages as needed. No experience necessary.

The position would require approx. 20 minutes per week. Training will be provided.

Help Needed on Sundays!

– **AV TEAM** needs soundboard operators and someone to run the Worship Service slides one Sunday per Month. No experience needed we will train you. If you can run PowerPoint slides, you can run the Sunday Service slides!

– **Nursery attendants** needed one Sunday per month. Childcare training will be provided if not already completed.

– **Hospitality Coordinator** needed. This is a leadership position. The coordinator has general oversight of all hospitality events and oversees kitchen management: supplies, organization, equipment, laundry, frozen food storage, and writing kitchen procedures as needed. The coordinator also recruits and schedules the refreshment team for after-church fellowship.

– **Hospitality Refreshment Team Members** needed one Sunday per month. Several areas of need are involved in this position: 1. Responsibility for preparing coffee at 10:00 a.m. for after church fellowship. 2. Serving coffee during the after church fellowship and clean up afterwards. Both positions would involve only one Sunday per month.
