Still on Pause? It's time to press play.

People are getting sick from COVID-19. Most are recovering as if they only got the flu, but others need serious medical attention to recover, and some



don't recover at all. It is a new virus, so there are still lots of unknowns, but our understanding of it is growing. But over the past year or so, the many and varied responses to the spread of COVID-19 has impacted all of us. Social Distancing, Isolation and Quarantines, Masks, Sanitization, Online Meetings, Vaccinations, Testing, Experimental Treatments, Prohibitions, Daily infection reports, Governmental regulations, and Study after study about this virus which has produced a wide array of findings that often conflict with one another.

As a result, nearly everyone pressed the "pause" button; and in many ways, our lives are still on pause because of it. For some, pausing was the result of the fears that spread along with the virus. Fear can be prudent, protecting us from danger; but unwarranted fears can prevent us from engaging in perfectly safe endeavors. And we need to move forward, living life together, for Christ, in a COVID world.

It's a great way to meet new people in our church.



Nominating Committee Procedures

As many of you know the Nomination of new officers of the church is now taking place.

Here is how it all works:

At least 8 weeks before the church election,

The Elders select nominating committee members.

Committee member's names are announced and/or published to the congregation.

The congregation is asked to submit the names of candidates for Elder, Deacon, and MAC

to the committee.

At least two (2) weeks shall be given for the congregation to submit names, after which the congregational nominating process shall be closed.

At least four (4) weeks prior to the election, the committee shall meet to discuss and vote on

nominations.

The committee members shall then contact approved nominees.

At least 2.5 weeks prior to the election, the committee shall meet to discuss interactions with candidates and finalize the ballot.

At least two (2) weeks prior to the election, ballots shall be published for the congregation.

The election shall be held the first Sunday in October or within one (1) week of that date.
